GYM CLOSED

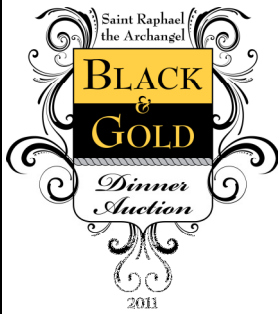

CHANGES IN THE MASS

And with your spirit.

Our Mass is written in Latin. Since Latin is a dead language, no one can tamper with it by assigning new definitions to old words. This assures the theological integrity of what we hear and say at Mass. The Second Vatican Council (1962-1965) made it possible that parts of, or even all of the Mass, could be said in the vernacular; therefore accurate translations from the Latin were to be produced.

For over a thousand years, dating back as far as the 4th century, when the ordained minister addressed the faithful with “The Lord be with you,” the response was “And with your spirit.” The Latin for this is “Et cum spiritu tuo.” The Italians, for example, translated this properly as “E con il tuo spirit.” The Spanish have “Y con tu espiritu.” The English world, however, did not receive a proper translation. We were given the more casual “And also with you.” The up-and-coming corrected translation will not only reflect the Latin original, but will bring us closer to saying what our brothers and sisters throughout the world have long been saying in *their* languages.

Why is this important?


First of all, the current response, used for only the last forty years, negates the scriptural significance. St Paul uses the words often: He says goodbye to the Galatians with “The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit” (Gal 6:18). He tells his beloved disciple Timothy, “The Lord be with your spirit” (2 Tm 4:22). There is also important theological significance. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) state that the liturgical dialogue in the Mass “is an exchange whereby all present – both Priest and congregation – ask that the Holy Spirit (whom we call “the Lord, the giver of life” in the Nicene Creed) establish a stronger communion among us.”

In addition, according to the USCCB, for the congregation to answer the Priest, “And with your spirit,” is actually a theological statement about what we Catholics believe regarding ordained ministers. No. 367 of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* speaks of how “spirit” can refer to an elevation of the soul, whereby the soul “is raised beyond all it deserves to communion with God.” Through Holy Orders, Christ has forever configured the Priest’s soul to Himself in a special way, by the power of the Holy Spirit. By specifically referencing the Priest’s spirit, we can affirm this transformation and pray for his ministry.

The response occurs five times: at the Introductory Rite, the Gospel, the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer, the Sign of Peace, and at the conclusion of Mass. We’re all of course accustomed to saying “And also with you,” but time will break us of that habit as we repeat more and more the beautiful response Holy Mother Church requests --- *And with your spirit.*
