PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners,

This week we welcome to Saint Raphael the Archangel Parish many of our grade school alumni. We are so pleased to have them join us for the 10 am Mass on Sunday. We extended this invitation as best we could to all our alumni, but, if any of our alumni has been missed, please indicate that they are always most welcome. It has been an arduous task to create a list of our graduates and their current addresses. Please extend to all our alumni and visitors this weekend a warm Saint Raphael welcome.

We said goodbye to Dorothy Feldmeier this week. Dorothy lived on Clifton across from Bishop DuBourg High School until moving into an assisted living facility several years ago. Dorothy and her husband Art were founding members of St. Raphael. In their day, you would often find her and Art helping out at the school picnics or working with the Girl Scouts and Cub Scouts. Dorothy was also a member of the Choir, Honor Guard and Ladies' Club. She was an avid traveler and once told a parishioner: "I'd sooner have my bags packed, than unpacked." Dorothy is survived by her five children, ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

In addition we celebrated the funeral for Mrs. Anna Stecko. Anna was the mother of Ann Kerry of our parish. At the end of WWI, after being an inmate in a work camp in Poland, she immigrated from Ukraine in 1949 at the age of 29. She lived as a widow for 37 years and moved to Rhodes in 1987. She would attend the 4:30 pm Mass with her daughter until the time at which she was unable to leave her home. Please remember in your prayers those who have died this week and their families and friends who mourn their loss.
