## Fr. John's Digital Quill for Spiritual Musings and Parish News

### *Receiving Communion By Intinction*

Someone recently asked me if, due to cold and flu season, one could receive Holy Communion by intinction. If you are not familiar with this practice, one takes the consecrated host and dips it into the Precious Blood and then consumes the Consecrated Host.

While certainly born out of a good desire to receive the Eucharist under both species, it is not appropriate for someone to do this on his/her own for a couple of reasons. First, the ritual foresees, if intinction is allowed, a plate to be used so that no drops of the Precious Blood fall to the ground. We do not have this procedure for Holy Communion here at St. Raphael. Additionally, to receive Holy Communion in this manner would be giving oneself Holy Communion, instead of receiving it from the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister. Giving oneself Communion is reserved exclusively to priests and bishops due to their share in the Priesthood of Christ.

Those who choose not to partake in the Precious Blood due to cold and flu season are still receiving the whole Jesus by receiving the Consecrated Host exclusively. This is assured by the doctrine of concomitance, which teaches that the whole Jesus is fully present under both species of bread and wine. While it is a fuller sign value to receive under both species, one is not losing out on any graces or receiving less Jesus by taking just the Consecrated Host and not the Precious Blood.

Thank you for the question and your attention to this matter.

### *Spiritual Gifts May Change*

I would like to include this reflection from Mr. David Baranowski of the Stewardship Office, writing about the Holy Spirit who gives us gifts at times and then calls us to exercise different gifts in the parish:

...our spiritual gifts do not stay constant throughout our lives. As we pass from childhood to adolescence to adulthood, our gifts change according to our age, where we are called and according to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes we know our gifts. Sometimes we do not. At some points in our lives we may use one gift and at other points we may use other gifts. The more we use our spiritual gifts, the greater the benefit to Jesus, to others and to us. Conversely, when we bury our talents, nothing good comes from it. Others lose and so do we. When we use our spiritual gifts, we reflect Jesus' light, love and mercy. When we don't, fear and pride set in.

If you are working in a parish ministry and you no longer feel the same love and joy as you did when you started, but rather you feel anger, irritability or dryness, this is a sign that it is time to move on. The Holy Spirit is calling you to use another gift for another purpose.

Let's apply this to a larger scale. Parish ministries are made up of individuals. If our individual spiritual gifts are changing/evolving, then our parish ministries are probably changing/evolving also. Maybe this is a time to "sunset" some of ministries that are no longer bearing good fruit. But more importantly, maybe this is an opportunity to develop new ministries and nurture new spiritual gifts within our parish.

Whether individually or at the parish level, be open to how God is calling you to build His kingdom and trust He is putting you in the right spot at the right time. Pray for the guidance to continue to develop and nurture your spiritual gifts.

# Relationship Check-In ✓



World Marriage Day  
February 10

There have been times in our marriage when we felt ourselves drifting apart. Not because of any one catastrophic event, but just because we weren't working on our relationship. We were just getting by. But in a culture antithetical to marriage, just getting by is not enough. All Catholic couples need to work to cultivate a dynamic, vibrant relationship, strong enough to bear the demands of family life, and weather everything the world will throw at it.

The reality is, we are never done working on our marriage. St. John Paul teaches us, "Love is never something ready made, something merely given to man and woman, it is...a task which they are set. Love should be seen as something which never 'is' but is always only 'becoming'..." This is true whether you have been married for 5 years or 50 years. We can never get to the point with our spouse when we say, "OK, now we finally have learned to love perfectly!" We never get there!

Take some time on to celebrate World Marriage Day by doing a "Relationship Check" with your spouse. Get away from the kids, from work, from the house and ask, "How are we doing?". Imagine your relationship as a separate entity (a tree is a good image). Step back from it and assess its health together. This isn't a time to point out faults or establish blame, instead it's a time to work together towards a noble goal.

You are the primary witness to the sanctity of the sacrament of matrimony. Your marriage is of vital importance not just to your family, but also to the whole Church! Don't allow yourselves to drift apart, but be intentional about having an exceptional marriage. 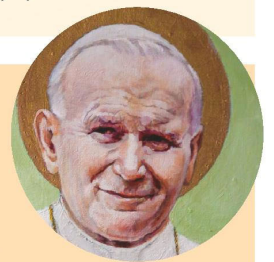
