Does it Count?

One question I am often asked during the Lenten Season is does it count? Does Sunday count towards the days of Lent? If it does not count, can I eat, drink, or do on Sunday what I gave up for Lent?

In the calculations for Lent, one is correct to say that Sundays do not count toward the forty total days of Lent. Since the earliest days of the Church, Sunday has been a day to remember the Lord's Resurrection. Truly, each Sunday is a "little Easter." So, when calculating Lent, the Church does not count the Sundays toward the forty-day count.

So then, can I do what I said I would not do during Lent? I like to answer that question in this way...

If it helps you to give up something during Lent and have it on Sunday, it may be a good idea to have a serving of it. For instance, a piece of candy, a soda, or an episode of a television show.

For other people, once they start back up, they cannot stop. So, if they partake a bit on Sunday, it makes the next days very difficult. In these cases, I do not think "cheating" a bit on Sunday is the best idea.

So which group do you fall into? Decide and that will help you to know if Sunday is a day to indulge a bit or to keep Lent going.

Since our students are on Spring Break this week, we will not be having the 8:00am Mass. Generally this will be our practice: that, when the students are out for only a day, we will have 8:00am Mass, but if gone for a week or so, we will cancel the 8:00am Mass. We thank

you for attending and praying with our school community.

Healing Mass, March 30 @ 10:00am

As we approach our Healing Mass, where we will ask the Lord for healing for the members of our community, it is good to remember who the Church calls to receive the Anointing of the Sick.

First, those who are facing a serious surgery are invited by the Church to receive the Anointing of the Sick. If someone, for instance, is about to have orthopedic surgery or heart surgery, the person would be invited to receive the anointing of the sick.

Second, those who have been diagnosed with a chronic illness are also invited to receive the sacrament. For instance, if someone has been diagnosed with cancer or another illness, the person may also receive the sacrament. People in this situation are invited to receive the sacrament many times throughout the course of their illness, so, if it has been awhile since you have been anointed, you may take this opportunity to receive the sacrament.

Third, those near death are also invited to receive the sacrament. Obviously, I would be happy to come to their residence in such a situation, but I mention it here just because I am outlining the various times when one may receive the sacrament.

Lastly, once one has reached an older age, according to the Catechism, a person may also receive the sacrament. The Church is vague on this point and leaves it up to the discretion of the minister and the person involved.

We will discuss next week about why one would want to receive the sacrament.



School News

Even though we are out on Spring Break, we have been doing many great things before break. Here are some things we have been up to...

From Ms. Chris, Pre-K B

Our highlight of the month was our STREAM activity for the letter T. We worked in small groups to brainstorm, devise a plan, and create train cars out of various recyclable materials. We put the train cars together to create one large train. The Bears are looking forward to Spring and can't wait for the warmer weather to arrive!

From Mrs. Schmidt, 1st Grade

The first graders can now tell time to the hour and half hour. We are in the middle of adding and subtracting double digit numbers without regrouping. After that we will be borrowing and regrouping when adding and subtracting double digit numbers.
