In recent years, devotion to and prayers requesting the intercession of the saints and angels have become more prevalent. This newsletter hopes to encourage ideas about devotion to the Archangel Raphael.

Contents of this issue are varied. The first item contains the news of a new pastor for St. Raphael parish in St. Louis. The next two stories concern the hurricane that struck Puerto Rico last year causing extensive damage. The San Rafael parish in Quebradillas suffered damage. In particular, one of the several chapels used to serve the large sprawling parish lost part of its roof and suffered interior damage. St. Raphael in St. Louis raised money to help repair the damaged chapel. Page three contains pictures of the parish church and the damaged chapel. The last entry presents a litany to St. Raphael the Archangel.

St. Raphael in St. Louis Lenten project

As its Lenten project, St. Raphael in St. Louis raised \$15,000 to assist with the repairs in Puerto Rico. The San Jose Chapel lost part of its roof and suffered water damage. Insurance covered part of the repair and the contribution from St. Louis helped cover much of the remaining cost.

St. Raphael the Archangel in Puerto Rico


On September 20, 2017, Hurricane Maria devastated much of the island of Puerto Rico. It damaged several of the chapels attached to the parish of San Rafael in Quebradillas, a town on the north central coast of the island. The parish has a central church and eight The San Jose Chapel smaller chapels. suffered the most damage, losing part of its roof and suffering water damage to the interior. The parish, which is about three miles long and seven miles wide, holds about 35,000 persons of whom some 70 percent are Catholic. The pastor, Rev. Jorge Virella, faced repairs of \$98,000 to \$110,000, with only some \$66,000 in insurance coverage.



San José Chapel, one of eight chapels under the pastoral care of Parroquia San Rafael in

Quebradillas, Puerto Rico, suffered the most extensive damage of all the chapels. Located close to the sea, a hurricane Sept. 20 ripped off material that covered the roof, flooding the inside of the chapel. The chapel's padded chairs were damaged and several doors also needed repair.
