St. Raphael in St. Louis Marks 70th Anniversary

St. Raphael the Archangel in St. Louis, Missouri, marked the 70th anniversary of its founding. Archbishop Joseph Ritter formed the parish in June, 1950, appointing the Reverend Arthur Behrman as the first pastor.

St. Raphael in St. Louis held a very low-key 70th Anniversary celebration. Because the city of St. Louis had imposed numerous health restrictions to help limit the spread of Covid-19, the usual celebrations did not take place. On Sunday, June 28, the pastor, Reverend John Mayo, celebrated an outdoor Mass on the parish parking lot. Parishioners watched from their cars and listened by way of their smart phones.

Today the parish has 469 families, a preschool, and a regular school that is operating both in the classroom and virtually.

Mass Celebrations in the Age of Covid-19

Initially, across the St. Louis area, there could be no parishioners present in church as the priest celebrated Mass, and it was streamed live for parishioners to watch. Then a limited number of people were admitted to the church for Sunday Mass. Now, the number has increased; but masks are still required.

Other parishes have similar stories to tell. Each city/county/state has its own variations to the rules to limit the virus.


St. Raphael Prayer To Find the Perfect Spouse
