FR. JOHN'S REPORT

Dear Families of St. Raphael the Archangel,

One of the staples at the end of Masses on Sunday is the announcement, "God Has This bracelets are on sale after Mass at the Jamieson and Highfield entrances." To date, we have purchased 3,000 bracelets, of which approximately 2,400 have been sold, with a dollar donation per bracelet to support our St. Vincent de Paul Society.

This idea came to one of our parishioners, Barbara Warnecke, after participating in a Scripture study here at St. Raphael about the *Acts of the Apostles*. This study was held in the wake of the announcement that the All Things New Pastoral Planning Process was being started in the Archdiocese. Through prayer and discussion with other people in the parish, she felt the Holy Spirit was calling her to bring this initiative to our attention. I readily saw her passion and the blessing of the Holy Spirit, and we went ahead with the purchase of the first 1,000 bracelets. We quickly ran out, leading to the purchase of another 1,000. We have now sold that lot and are waiting on 500 additional bracelets.

Someone recently asked me after Mass what do the bracelets mean. Probably some people have come to their own understanding of the saying as they have worn their bracelet these many months. So my explanation is not to supplant, but hopefully just to add to these beautiful reflections people have had over the past year.

To say God Has This is to make a statement in faith in a personal, loving God, who deeply cares for me. This God is very interested in my life and is working in my life, before, during, and after I act. God's action reminds me that my life is not my own and that I am never alone. He has it all in His hands and is working with me in whatever I do.

In these next months, we may need to be reminded of our common faith in such a God. Just a few weeks after I write and you read these words, we will gather as a community to hear the proposed parish models. Sometime before registration in January, we will hear about the models for schools. These impending announcements, I know, concern many in our community.

No matter what will be announced in October, or before registration, or in May 2023, God Has This. God, we pray, has and will continue to guide the All Things New process. God will be there when these announcements come and will understand our reactions, whatever they may be. God will be there to help us process these and to prepare for what may lie ahead for the future good of the parish, the school, and the wider Church of our area.

May we continue to remember that indeed God Has This!

FINANCIAL DISCUSSION FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

On behalf of our Finance Committee, we are happy to present to you our financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022.

During this period, your generosity continued to humble us. Our weekly giving averaged \$9,885 per week. This was an increase of over \$700 per week as compared to that of the previous year. We are truly grateful for your generous sacrifices each week in the weekly offertory.

Your continued generosity helped us as we experienced increases in operating costs. The increase in inflation did see a substantial rise in the cost of food for school programs. Also, repairs to essential parts of the campus such as the walk-in cooler, gym lighting, and the school elevator were able to be handled promptly thanks to your generosity.

Even with these unexpected costs, we were able to still have a small profit at the end of the year. This profit continues to allow us to maintain a healthy cash reserve for possible future repairs as well as to keep our necessary reserve on deposit with the Archdiocese, which helps to demonstrate our parish vibrancy.

Beyond these unexpected necessary repairs, we also completed in this fiscal year the rectory and church roofing project. We have also seen a majority of the work completed on the school shingle and low slope roofs, and we hope that final inspections and payments will be able to happen shortly. These projects were all paid for from a variety of sources, but the generosity of parishioners overall made these necessary projects a reality. Thank you!

The rectory basement project continues to progress slowly. We have contracted with a waterproofing company to complete some needed work to address some leaking in the basement, especially around the windows. Following this work, Woodard will re-

turn to complete the restoration of the space. We expect this work to take at least the rest of the calendar year of 2022. Most of these expenses are thankfully covered by insurance.


Due to All Things New, we do not expect any other new large projects in this fiscal year. We are aware of projects that need to be completed on the church from the 50 and Beyond Campaign, as well as the deteriorating state of the parking lot, which also needs to be addressed. Following All Things New, we hope that we will understand a process through which we can follow through on these promises and needs.

As we look ahead to this fiscal year, we continue to use a conservative budgetary philosophy. This helps to position us well on both revenue and expenses for what may come during the next fiscal year. We do show at the end of this fiscal year that we will have a healthy budget surplus. In the first couple of months of this fiscal year, we are grateful that you continue to be generous as we are seeing our expenses lessen through good financial controls and a moderating of some inflationary pressures.

Thank you again for your great support of our parish and school. We will continue to work with Fr. John and Mrs. Hayes to be the best stewards of your gifts to St. Raphael Parish.




INCOME VS. EXPENSES


