Tobit and the Catechism

he new Catechism of the Catholic Church has eleven citations from the Book of Tobit. Paragraph 2361 actually quotes a section of the Book of Tobit, where Tobias and Sarah pray together on their wedding night. The section of the Catechism is "The Love of Husband and Wife." The Book of Tobit is one of the few books of the Bible which focuses on domestic life. For the most part, it is the story of rather ordinary people and their very real daily problems and how they lead their lives according to Faith. The divine intervention to solve their problems is the Archangel Raphael, an answer to their prayers. Their edifying lives reflected by practices of the corporal works of mercy and faith-filled approach to marriage and sex are held up to us as examples to be followed.

Blessed by an Angel

e are witnessing an extraordinary boom of interest in angels. Angels are everywhere! The terms "angelology" and "angelologist" are commonplace. Why are we experiencing the greatest resurgence of interest in angels since the Renaissance? Does this indicate angelmania, or positive trends?

Nearly 70% of Americans believe in angels; nearly 33% claim to have felt an angel's presence. Angel sites have surfaced on the internet and three national magazines are devoted exclusively to angels. Since 1995, many nonfiction books about angels have appeared on best-seller lists. A growing number of movies including *Michael* and *The Preacher's Wife* feature angels. The television series *Touched by an Angel* has high ratings.

Flooding the market are collectible figurines, jewelry, candles, paper products, Christmas ornaments, and tree-top decorations. Personalized angel poems celebrate birthdays. In a 1997 eight-disc series of classical music, angels are presented in sound and music by Angel Records. Inner peace is experienced through "timeless music and the realm of angels."

These developments in our culture give cause for us to reevaluate and revitalize our devotion to our Patron, St. Raphael the Archangel. St. Raphael parishioners throughout the world who share a common bond...let us take time to review and fine-tune our devotion!

Of course, we consider angels only in the light of Church teachings. We know that angels appear nearly 300 times in the Bible. The New Testament's Book of Tobit and its account of St. Raphael are our sources of inspiration, instruction, and hope as we prepare for the 21st century.

St. Raphael is a special messenger from God, who takes away our fears, who empowers us in our ministries, and who enriches our lives. All St. Raphael parishes are indeed blessed by an angel!

San Rafael

ne St. Raphael parish hand delivered materials to us in St. Louis! Mr. Paul Coddington who is in charge of the gift shop at the San Rafael Mission in San Rafael, California was to visit St. Louis anyway, so he made a short detour to drop off items and see our church building.

The modern St. Raphael parish church in San Rafael is at the site of the old mission. Alongside the church is a restored copy of the original Franciscan mission of San Rafael. The original Mission of San Rafael Arcangel was founded in 1817 as a hospital mission to aid the Mission Delores in San Francisco. It was dedicated to the Archangel Raphael as the angel of bodily healing. It was the secondlast of the missions built between 1769 and The mission soon grew to support an Indian community of more than 1000. The mission was the first to be secularized by Mexican civil authorities in 1833. The mission was disbanded and the building disappeared. In 1949, a replica of the original mission was built alongside the current parish church of St. Raphael.

t. Raphael in St. Louis will be celebrating the feast day with a Buffet Dinner. This is the second year for the dinner which will be held on Saturday evening, September 27, in our parish auditorium.


