St. Raphael Booklet by Angela Carol

The 53 page booklet <u>St. Raphael, Angel of Marriage, of Healing, of Happy Meetings, of Joy and of Travel</u> by Angela Carol has been reissued by Tan Books. This booklet, which was originally released in 1955, contains a variety of explanations and reflections on the Book of Tobit and the Archangel Raphael.

Although the booklet contains some pre-Vatican II terminology and thinking, which may displease some readers, the author presents many worthwhile points.

The author briefly discusses angels and then retells the Book of Tobit. She examines Raphael under the titles of the Angel of Health, the Angel of Love, the Angel of Joy, and the Angel of Light. Of special interest are questions concerning a happy married life and the necessity of seeking God's help in the vocation of marriage.

The final section contains a litany of Saint Raphael, a novena prayer, and several devotional prayers.

The front cover of the pamphlet displays an attractive depiction of St. Raphael by Brother Simeon, which dates from 1986.

"Angel Burst"

The St. Raphael Church in Glendale, Arizona has a sanctuary tapestry entitled "Angel Burst." The two-fold symbolic motif is that of the Archangel Raphael adoring the eternal presence of Almighty God and hovering above the Eucharistic worship of the parish. The design is done in earth-tone colors of the southwest and reflects the native culture of the Arizona Indians. This creative, dramatic tapestry was designed by liturgical artist Maureen McGuire and woven by women of the parish community. The colors are exquisite: a gold center, with gold, red, and black wings.
