St. Raphael Cathedral at Madison, Wisconsin

Last spring the diocese had the steeple of the fire-destroyed St. Raphael Cathedral in Madison dismantled. Plans to build a new Cathedral are on hold. The steeple was carefully taken down in three sections and these are being stored in the hope that may be used in the new cathedral when it is built. In addition, three bells from the steeple, stained glass windows and various mosaics that survived the fire have been saved and, hopefully, will be reused.

St. Raphael Church in St. Louis is pleased to announce that it has a new pastor, Monsignor Henry J. Breier, Jr. Monsignor Breier was ordained in 1994 and served as an associate pastor in south St. Louis county. He served as Secretary to Archbishop Justin Rigali (now Cardinal archbishop of Philadelphia) and then to Archbishop Raymond Burke (currently in Rome as the head of the Vatican's Supreme Tribunal of Apostolic Signatura) and then briefly to St. Louis's new archbishop, Most Rev. Robert J. Carlson.

St. Raphael The Archangel Hospital in Baghdad

Recent articles on the Iraqi health care crisis point to the public system's lack of funds, delays, and repeated power failures. Those able to pay for treatment can go to a private hospital for better care. Saint Raphael Hospital in the Karrade area of Baghdad is specifically mentioned as one such hospital. St. Raphael is a 35-bed hospital; however, the facility can treat as many as 1,000 patients a day. Because threats have been made against the physicians, as many as ten live in the building full time. The streets leading to the hospital have concrete blocks to restrict rapid approach to the facility and Iraqi troops guard the doors.

Please pray for those at St. Raphael Hospital in Baghdad.

St. Raphael Hymn


(based on All Glory, Laud, and Honor)
