St. Raphael the Archangel in Garden City, Michigan

St. Raphael Parish in Garden City, Michigan, has been merged out of existence. On July 1, 2014, Saint Raphael Parish and Saint Dustan Parish merged to form the new St. Thomas the Apostle. The new church has the address of the former church so the parish must have retained that building as the place of worship. The school is now referred to as St. Thomas the Apostle School.

Saint Raphael in Springfield, Ohio

As the *Newsletter* reported several issues ago, Saint Raphael Parish in Springfield, Ohio, has joined with Saint Joseph Parish. Both parishes appear to be maintaining their original church buildings, but have the joint name of St. Joseph and St. Raphael. St. Raphael Church, dating from the 1890s, presents an imposing sight with two front towers, one a 135-foot-tall bell tower and the other a 184-foot principal tower. The National Register of Historic Places added the building to its list in June 1976, due to the church's historically significant architecture.

St. Raphael In St. Louis

St. Raphael in St. Louis is marking its 65th anniversary this year. Founded in 1950 in the southwest corner of the city, the parish continues to serve the Catholic community with both an active congregation and a thriving school. The parish is an anchor in this part of St. Louis city, a steadying influence that incorporates Christian witness and values.

St. Raphael in Oshkosh, Wisconsin


St. Raphael Parish in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, sent the *Newsletter* a copy of its attractive, spiral-bound-20-page booklet that gives a detailed description of the church and a short history of the parish.

The parish, officially founded in 1978, built its church in 1986. By 1992 this building proved inadequate for a parish of 1,100 families, so a new church was constructed. The new church, completed in 1994, is of modern design. However, it incorporates traditional elements by using stained glass windows and stations of the cross from older churches. Thus, the church uses both modern design and traditional art work.

A statue of St. Raphael the Archangel stands in the courtyard in front of the church entrance to greet church goers. This statue originally came from a Catholic hospital in Stevens Point, Wisconsin

The church nave is ringed with cathedral windows that alternate between clear glass and twelve stained glass windows depicting each of the twelve apostles. These windows, which came from Germany in 1908, were intended for another Catholic Church.

The church's stations of the cross originally graced the walls of an older church torn down years earlier. These individually plaster-cast and hand-painted stations eventually came to the new church and now occupy spaces between the windows.
