St. Raphael the Archangel in Costa Rica

In his report to the St. Louis Society for the Propagation of the Faith, Msgr. Francis X. Blood highlighted missionary work in a remote section of Costa Rica. The parish is "San Rafael." A Franciscan Missionary from El Salvador, Fr. Jose Celedonio Martinez Argueta, presides over a parish that holds more than 40 small villages within the parish boundaries. Each village has its own little chapel. The parishioners are migrants from Nicaragua, mostly farmers who are very poor. Because of dangerous roads during the rainy season and the high price of gasoline, Fr. Jose often travels by mule to his remote villages.

St. Raphael In Rockford, Maryland

Last year St. Raphael in Rockford, Maryland, celebrated its 50th anniversary as a parish. The parish continues its celebration this year with a parish picnic on September 25. Rev. James P. Meyers, an associate pastor, a retired Monsignor, and four deacons serve the parish. The parish provides its Hispanic population with a 1:00 p.m. Sunday Mass in Spanish.

In 2006 the parish opened the newest school in the Archdiocese of Washington, D. C., completing the building in 2011. By adding a grade each year, the school was able to hold its first graduation in 2014.

St. Raphael the Archangel in St. Louis

St. Raphael in St. Louis has a new pastor, the Reverend Robert J. Reiker. He replaced Monsignor Henry Breier.

The parish celebrated the 50th anniversary of its founding in 2000. However, beginning this year, the parish will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the new Church building, by marking the various dates in its construction: the cornerstone laying, the transfer from the temporary church to the new building, and the archbishop's formal dedication.

In connection with this anniversary, the parish will begin a campaign to fund various necessary repairs and updates to ready the church building for the next fifty years. Merging with the St. Louis Archdiocesan Beyond Sunday campaign that funds Catholic schools, the parish will raise money to replace the church roof, to repaint the interior, and to address other needed repairs.

St. Raphael in Art



The above is a reproduction of the 1880 painting of *Tobias and the Angel* (Palais des Beaux Arts, Lille, France) by Jean Charles Cazin (1841-1901). The artist favored landscape settings and religious subjects.

The painting is in the style of the French Art Academy of the time that emphasized realism and almost photographic presentation. Most modern painting evolved as a reaction against this approach.
