FATHER BOB'S COLUMN

STEWARDSHIP - A CATHOLIC WAY OF LIFE

What is stewardship? Being a good steward! So, what is a steward? The dictionary says that a steward is a person who manages other people's property or affairs, or a person in charge of a household. Applying this to our Catholic spirituality, Stewardship is the reality that the Lord God has put us in charge of a portion of his creation, namely our own selves, and our families and households. God has given us all we have – life, health, the earth, the Church. The Lord expects us to be responsible stewards of these blessings and opportunities. We have chosen to be disciples of Jesus and his Gospel in the Catholic Church. Being faithful disciples includes being responsible stewards who commit to taking good care of what the Lord has entrusted to us.

Today at Mass, the head of the Archdiocesan Office of Stewardship, Mr. David Baranowski, has been invited by me to speak to our St. Raphael Parish Family. He will encourage us to review how we are taking responsibility for the gifts of time and talent that we have been blessed with. He will be encouraging us to evaluate how we are sharing our precious time and valuable talent with the Lord and his Church here at St. Raphael Parish.

HOLY WEEK – NEXT SUNDAY IS PALM SUNDAY AND THEN THE SACRED TRIDUUM

The holiest days of the whole annual liturgical cycle start next weekend with our Palm Sunday processions. For each of the three

weekend Masses, we will start with the <u>Blessings of Palms out on the lawn at the street corner</u>. From there we will process over to the front doors of church and enter into our holy place, while we acknowledge Jesus as our Savior and King.

Then come the <u>Sacred Three Days (Triduum)</u> of Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, including the Washing of Feet and procession to the altar of repose; Good Friday in the afternoon with the Celebration of the Lord's Passion; and Saturday evening with the Easter Vigil, the most glorious liturgy of the whole year. The liturgies for each of these three holy days are basically one long liturgical celebration of the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' Death and Resurrection, separated into three parts. Be sure to participate in all three to get the full spiritual experience of the heart of our Catholic Faith!



St. Raphael's Parish and School 2017 Lenten Project For Queen of Peace Center

Slow and steady is said to win the race...but we need to pick up the pace a bit in order to reach our \$20,000 goal to buy a van for the Queen of Peace Center (QOPC). This van will help the local women and children currently being served by the Queen of Peace Center, like Kimberly. Kimberly was living in a shelter, addicted to drugs, without employment, food stamps and hope for improving her situation. She then came to QOPC for residential treatment for her substance abuse issues; she later moved on to outpatient treatment utilizing the Shelter Plus Care Housing (which is part of QOPC). Within a year of her walking through the QOPC doors, she has gotten a job, moved into a fair market apartment and no longer relies on Shelter Plus Care rental and utility assistance. We are happy to share that Kimberly is living a clean and sober life today and has the support and resources of QOPC to rely on if things get challenging. The Queen of Peace Center van enabled Kimberly to be transported to and from the main location of the Center to her QOPC housing on a daily basis.
