FATHER BOB'S COLUMN

HOLY WEEK - STARTS TODAY WITH PALM SUNDAY!

Today, <u>Palm Sunday</u>, we are schizophrenic liturgically. At the beginning of the Mass, we are waving our palms and singing, "Hosanna, to the Son of David," Jesus, our Messiah, our hero. A few minutes later, during the proclamation of the Passion of the Lord, we are shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Such is the reality of our human nature. We need redemption!

It's coming; hang in there! By *Holy Thursday*, the <u>first day of the Sacred Triduum</u>, Jesus graciously gives us an example of humble service by washing the feet of the apostles, and then tells us to do the same. As pastor, at the 7pm liturgy, I will be washing the feet of 12 parish members as a humble sign of my willingness to serve the St.

Raphael Parish Family. Then the Lord gives us "the gift that keeps on giving" – the Holy Eucharist – Sunday after Sunday, year after year for almost 2,000 years. We celebrate the Lord's Last Supper with a joyful Mass, at least until the final reposition of the Blessed Sacrament at the side altar of repose, followed by an opportunity for silent prayer with Jesus. The church will be open for visitation from 8:30pm to midnight. Jesus said, "Can you not pray with me for at least an hour?"



The <u>second day of the Triduum – **Good Friday!** At 3pm come to church for the Celebration of the Lord's Passion</u>

- the exact time of Jesus' death on the cross. This rather somber liturgy includes, besides the reading of the Passion, the very moving Veneration of the Cross by each one present. At this service we have the chance to reflect on how much the Lord Jesus loves each of us, so much that he was willing to give his life for us.

The climax, the final and third act, so to speak, of the Triduum is the *Easter Vigil* at 7:30pm on Holy Saturday. This unusually beautiful liturgy is the most exciting celebration of the whole Church Year. It includes listening in a darkened church to the readings from the Old Testament that lay out God's plan of salvation as it developed. Then the lighting of the New Fire and the large Easter Candle, followed by the sung proclamation of the Exsultet, a poetic expression of the Easter event; then the Easter Gospel about the empty tomb and the resurrected Christ. The climax might well be the Blessing of the Water for Baptism, the Baptism of Chrystal Montgomery and the Profession of Faith of Karol Bick. Our two newest members then receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and their First Communion. This Easter Vigil is the "full meal deal" of an Easter Mass celebration. Or you can celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at 8am or 10am Easter morning.

All in all, I cannot stress enough how spiritually uplifting it is for a Catholic to celebrate all three parts of the Sacred Triduum – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. So do it!!! Why not???



PRINCIPAL'S COLUMN

Dear St. Raphael School Families,

I hope you are all making plans to attend the Holy Week Triduum Masses and Services at St. Raphael; the experience of attending all of these Masses is powerful and moving. While it might be difficult for very young children, these are certainly important liturgies for all school-aged Catholic children in order to see their Catholic faith come alive. As a Catholic school community, it is of utmost importance that our students see these traditions at home as well as at school!

Thanks to so many families who have completed their school registration for 2017-2018! If you have not yet registered, you will be hearing from the school office, if you have not already. We would really benefit from having solid registration numbers as soon as possible. We will be making many decisions about teacher assignments, teacher aides, and the ordering of books, supplies and technology items. Without solid registration numbers, it is very difficult to make sound spending decisions. We completely understand what a sacrifice you are making to send your children to St. Raphael, and we are most grateful that you give us the honor of educating your children. Please try to understand our position from the business perspective and assist us in making responsible financial decisions by getting your registration completed as soon as you are able. Thank you!

Some of you have asked about how we will go about hiring any new teachers that we might need for 2017-2018, given that St. Raphael will have a new principal. This is what that process looks like. First of all, we don't officially know all of the teaching positions we will have open for the next school year. Teachers have received their contracts and have until the 1st of May to sign and return them. Once we know for certain that there will be an opening, the position is posted on the Archdiocesan website. The new principal for St. Raphael will have been hired and announced by then; the new principal and I will work together to hire any needed teachers for next school year. Both of our perspectives will be necessary for this search process, and we will work together to make the best possible hiring decisions for St. Raphael School. And again, I will make those announcements as appropriate. You are always welcome to ask questions, and I hope this helps you to know what to expect.

Enjoy this sometimes crazy spring weather in St. Louis, and please keep our students and teachers in your prayers.

Camden, born while Amanda was in the QOPC treatment program, is now a healthy six-month old. Both Amanda and Camden reside at one of the QOPC's houses, but Amanda is currently looking for a job and ready to get her own apartment. What a blessing QOPC has been to both Amanda and Camden.
