How Did That Happen?

Over the past week, I have heard this question from many people. This question was mostly asked because of the great generosity that many people gifted to the parish on the first Sunday of August. A flurry of similarly worded questions began again after seeing the church fuller than normal for a 10:00am Mass last weekend. "How did that happen?" people asked me.

The other question people asked me was how do we keep this trend going. Being able to meet our budget regularly on a weekly basis is a sign of a vibrant parish. Further the energy and enthusiasm of a full church is something special that makes Sunday Mass attractive to others and to us to attend.

The first question speaks to an attitude that needs to be challenged. In my first column, I referenced the phrase #SRAstrong. This phrase not only speaks to a future that we are building together but it also speaks to the reality we experience in the here and now. When we see some negative trends, they can cause us to forget who we are and the great things that are happening.

I know that we have a great parish. The energy, enthusiasm, and willingness to do and sacrifice for the community makes this a place people want to be part of. Certainly, we have our share of challenges. But those challenges can never shake us from the reality of who we are and the work of the Holy Spirit happening around us.

With a knowledge of who we are and confidence in the Holy Spirit's direction, how do we keep this going? We all need to keep doing our part.

We all desire a full church...so help fill the pews by making the time this Sunday and every Sunday to make Mass a priority.

We all desire a church that can fulfill its obligations...so help us to do that by making a sacrificial gift to the parish.

We all desire a vibrant parish that is full of life and that people ask us how do they get involved in...so let us speak about the good things happening and encourage people to look at us again. So may these two weeks inspire us afresh with confidence in our parish. We are #SRAstrong: not just in words but in reality as well.

We have heard several comments that the newest batch of pews were not completed in the same manner as the previous pews. We are in contact with the company and this will be addressed as soon as they can come back to the St. Louis area, as the company is located in Wisconsin. Also, there have been some comments about the new kneelers being sharp or splintering. This is largely due to the material used in constructing them. Since it is the material, there is little that sanding or other fixes could do to permanently solve this issue. Please consider setting them down with your hand versus flipping down with your foot.

Return to School

It was a joy to greet our students on a wet Wednesday morning as we began a new school year. The enthusiasm and smiles from the students was great to see!

On Thursday, we had an event to greet our preschoolers and they will be having their first day of school on Monday. As we open the school year, we have 149 students in our grade school K-8 and 51 preschoolers. With these numbers we remain optimistic about our future!

I am also happy to announce that the supplies to install the LED lighting in the school have arrived. We will be working with the contractor to get the lights installed as quickly as possible with as minimum of disruption to routine.

Also, our camera system will be up and running soon to provide monitoring in and around our school. Our school remains committed to excellence and to providing the safest environment possible for our students.

Preschool of Religion

As was announced last weekend, the preschool of religion program will be returning to SRA! This will be at the 10:00am Mass beginning the Sunday after Labor Day, September 9. Children ages 3 to 1st grade are invited to participate. We will call them up for a blessing after the opening prayer of Mass and they will come back before communion.

We are in need of parents to help to supervise and mentor or teens from 8th grade to high school. We are also in need of teens who will prepare and teach the lessons to the children. Please contact the parish office or me if you are interested in helping with this important ministry of bringing children closer to Christ through His word.

Fellowship (Donut) Sundays

I have had a few questions about when someone will be able to get a donut again. Thanks to our Parish Council, we do have dates scheduled for these fellowship Sundays for the next year. Instead of going with a consistent Sunday that could cause conflicts with other events in the parish, we decided to look at each month independently and pick the best weekend. We will also be approaching organizations and asking them to take months or to signup for a month. I hope that this new system will help to make this time more popular than ever! All of the dates are posted on the Google Calendar for the church.

Seminarians at SRA

This week, I will be attending a meeting at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary where I will receive word on who we will be receiving from the seminary to serve in our parish this year. Having gone through the formation program myself, I know the benefit of the Sunday and weekly experience in the parish while preparing to become a priest. I also know that we will benefit greatly from the men who we will receive as well.

Excerpts from “Please Don’t Ask Me to Sing In The Choir!” by Thomas L. Are

Surprised By Reward

“His master said to him, ‘well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.’ ” Matthew 25:21

“Ed, you have a beautiful voice,” she said.

“Oh, I do”? he responded. “Then give all the credit to the Lord. I just sing to praise Him.”

I don’t know why Ed’s piety disturbs me. I guess I don’t trust him. I hope I don’t serve God to earn some profit, but I confess I find singing in the choir rewarding.

On the way home, I asked my daughter, “Do we serve God hoping for some payoff”?

“I hope not. It sort of reduces God to an accountant. I give Him a dime’s worth of service and He awards me a dime’s worth of blessing, with profit, of course. I don’t like that.” she said. “Where does love fit in?”

I agree with my daughter. We relate to God by love, not law. We could give God all we own and still not balance the books. We will always be in debt to Him. His goodness expresses His grace, but never His obligation to us. I wish we could remove reward as motive.

Yet Jesus appealed to rewards in His parables and the Sermon on the Mount. To the faithful servant He said, “Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.” Good works are better than bad works in God’s eyes and He does not respond to them in the same way. Some said, “Remove rewards and apathy has the last word.”

While I seek to serve God because I love Him, at the same time I am aware that my faithfulness brings an inner satisfaction. Sometimes I am rewarded with more work to do, but always the reward catches me by surprise. I never feel deserving of it. God gives it out of His grace and that’s the greatest prize of all.

Yes, I do find singing in the choir rewarding.

Prayer: *Lord, help us to serve because we love you. And when you reward us, fill us with surprised gratitude.*

A Prayer before Holy Mass
