## GUEST COLUMN: GIFT OF MERCY BY DAVID BARANOWSKI, STEWARSHIP DIRECTOR, ARCHDIOCESE OF ST. LOUIS

Most of us don't deserve the mercy God gives us. The punishment we deserve for our sins far outweighs the mercy we receive.

We are called to imitate Christ. We are called to show mercy to others, regardless of how much they have wronged us. Yet, we hand out punishment easily. Our mercy is a different story.

Years ago a promise was made to me that I really wanted. Several years later, the promise turned out to be a lie. I became enraged. What made it worse was that the person who made the promise was someone I considered to be a good friend and a mentor. He was someone that I admired. I carried hate and anger with me for several years. It consumed me. It became my "idol." It gave me my reason to be mean and nasty to others. I felt betrayed and I wanted everyone to know it and also feel the pain.

Through God's grace I eventually recognized my brokenness. I realized I needed to change. I realized I needed God's help and that I couldn't forgive on my own. God opened my eyes to show me that this person I was angry with was actually a gift and not a burden for me to carry around. I felt awful. I was ashamed of all the terrible things I said to my friend. I was ashamed of how I treated others as a result of my anger, especially my family and friends, the people who loved me, even though I was not easy to love at the time.

I went to the sacrament of Reconciliation, and it was life-changing. I asked for and received God's mercy and forgiveness. This is going to sound corny but every time I walk out of the confessional now I hear the first lyric of Amazing Grace playing in my head. "Amazing Grace! How sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see."

My friend lives out of town, but God's grace contin-

ued. He came back to St. Louis for a visit and we were able to meet. We showed each other mercy and renewed our friendship.

There is a lot of hatred and anger in the world right now. Many are searching for justice and equality. Maybe we need to balance the equation with mercy and compassion.


God teaches us that for our sins to be forgiven, we must also forgive those who've hurt us. When hate is in our hearts, there's no room for God's love. How can we expect God to be merciful if we refuse to show mercy? Forgiveness is often easier said than done; only God can give us the strength to forgive through prayer.

So, here's a suggestion. Before we get together to meet on things that divide us, maybe we should spend time together, to pray for and with each other in the sacrament of Reconciliation and at Holy Mass and to ask for God's mercy and guidance. It has been said that you can't give what you don't have. Maybe we need to experience God's mercy and forgiveness before we can give them to others. Maybe we need to change before we can expect others to change. Maybe we all need to become better stewards of the gift of mercy.




## HELLO, SRA BOOK LOVERS!

## FROM ARCHBISHOP MITCHELL ROZANSKI'S FIRST HOMILY AS ARCHBISHOP OF ST. LOUIS, GIVEN AUGUST 25, 2020, FEAST OF ST. LOUIS

**Back in late February** - just six months ago - could any of us imagine how within days we would be plunged into the greatest pandemic to affect the human race in over 100 years. As we mourn the passing of tens of thousands of our fellow citizens and offer prayers for the millions among us who are still struggling with the impact of the coronavirus, we share the frustration of its devastating impact on all of our lives, be they physical, emotional or economical.

**But, brothers and sisters,** COVID-19 is not the only urgent cross facing us today. As a nation and, as indeed a church, we find ourselves still struggling with the scars of systemic racism in our society.

**Our civil discourse** these days is not very civil. When a person shares a differing opinion from ours, the tendency is to demonize the other, often in deeply personal ways, eclipsing any type of dialogue, common ground or understanding. As Catholics, as Christians, we need to ask, "Where is God in all of this?"

**You only have** to look into the words of Jesus in today's Gospel - "Love one another as I have loved you." How many times have we heard these words

of Jesus from the Gospel of John? Jesus wanted his own to love one another as He has loved us.

**In the midst of a pandemic**, a societal reckoning on the life issue of race relations and civil discourse and, yes, the often sinful polemics within the church are difficult. Loving one another seems to be a tough thing to do these days.

**Yet, my brothers and sisters**, we are called to be a people of hope. As a community, the church must practice love.

**I am humbly called** to be with you in this ecclesiastical community of St. Louis. This gateway city provides us rich imagery. In order for us to live out this fundamental command to love one another the command must be carried out in action. We ourselves must be gateways, not gatekeepers. Gateways to healing, to evangelization, to mercy, to compassion. Gateways to listening with the ears of Jesus.
