FATHER BOB'S COLUMN

ADVENT CONTINUES – THE COMING OF THE LORD IS CLOSER! PREPARE THE WAY!

The Prophet Isaiah shares with us the God's message that he wants someone to comfort his people who are crying out with so many needs- spiritual, physical, emotional. We are so often included in that group of God's people who need comfort. So what is God going to do about it? The Almighty has the prophet advise us that there will be a voice in the dessert, not in the mainstream of society, who will challenge us to "make straight a highway for our God." And then we shall experience the glory of the Lord.

This message was not meant just for the people of Israel, but also for us here at St. Raphael in 2017. The voice in the dessert turns out to be St. John the Baptist who in the gospel today "proclaims a baptism of repentance," and announces that one greater than he is coming. Indeed that message of hope will come true again when we celebrate in our Christmas liturgy the birth of Jesus the Savior, still mysteriously changing our world and our lives.

Now during this Advent season with its meager two weeks left, we need to straighten out the crooked, sinful entrance into our heart and soul, so that Jesus can be revealed to us anew at Christmas. The parish Christmas letter, that was just sent out, includes opportunities next week for you to repent of your sins as John the Baptist encourages us and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Christmas. (Confession times are in that letter or on page 6 of today's bulletin.)

TUESDAY, DEC. 12th, FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

When the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in 1531 to a poor native-American at Tepeyac, Mexico, her face was that of woman of mixed blood, a *mestiza*, and her garments bore many symbols of the native Aztec culture. She identified herself as Mary,

mother of the true God, and so made a new "visitation" to these people, some of whom were new converts to Christianity. She intended to remain with them through a mysterious sacred image of herself imprinted on St. Juan Diego's *tilma*, or cloak, made of cactus cloth that seldom lasts more than 20 years. But now almost 500 years later, it is still on display high over the main altar in the great basilica of Guadalupe, near Mexico City.

Here in our St. Raphael Church, we have a replica of that sacred icon of Mary displayed in our main vestibule. The old faded image was replaced a month ago by a new, more vivid and quite detailed painting of Our Lady of Guadalupe. For Tuesday's Mass we will display in the sanctuary this new image of Mary and bless it at both the 7am and 8am Masses.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patron of Mexico and honored throughout all the Americas.

In 1531, on December 9, Juan Diego encountered the apparition of a young woman surrounded by light, on the hill of Tepeyac, northwest of what is now Mexico City. He understood that she was the Mother of God. She asked that a church be built there in her honor. Juan Diego carried her request to the bishop who asked for a sign of her authenticity. The Lady told Diego to gather flowers from the top of the hill where there should have been no flowers on that rocky ground in winter. To the contrary, he found

roses, which the Lady arranged for him in his cloak, or tilma. When Diego returned to the bishop and opened his cloak, the roses fell out to reveal the image of Our Lady on the fabric. In 1999, Pope Joan Paul II declared Our Lady of Guadalupe the Patroness of the Americas and the Protectress of the Unborn, putting the Culture of Life under her protection. In 2002, John Paul II canonized Juan Diego. The tilma, or cloak, of Juan Diego, on which the image is preserved, should have disintegrated within 30 years, since it was made of cactus cloth. But it has maintained its structural integrity across nearly 500 years.

May Our Lady of Guadalupe protect us and all of her children, especially the unborn.
