THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT - "GAUDETE" SUNDAY - REJOICE!

Today is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, marking the halfway point through the season of Advent (although this year it is about the two-thirds point). Rose-colored vestments can be worn, and the rose candle is lit. We rejoice because we trust that God is taking care of us and is planning on sending us his Son as our Savior. The first reading from Isaiah the Prophet proclaims, "I rejoice heartily in the Lord; in my God is the joy of my soul." St. Paul in the second reading commands us to "rejoice always."

A prayer for this week: "Jesus, today you draw my gaze towards Christmas, which is now coming nearer. Do not let me be taken in by weariness or sadness, even though I may have reason to be because of my many concerns and the many forms of violence which wound our humanity. May your coming fill my heart with joy. Come, Lord Jesus!" from Pope Francis
