A Reflection on Our Lady of Guadalupe

When people look at you, what do they see?

Certainly, this question inspired our mothers to teach us essential life lessons, such as to comb our hair, brush our teeth, wipe our face, and so on. This concern goes farther. I remember a couple of weeks ago, I was going out to lunch with a priest friend after Sunday Masses. As I went to change, I pulled out a Cardinals pullover I had worn several times before. The thought, before I put it on, was what was he going to think? After all, I had worn it so many times before, what would he think if I wore it again? Now this is a good friend of mine and a brother priest...why would he care? But the thought was there.

This concern for what people think affects us in many more ways than our appearance. For instance, we may want to do something good for someone but stop, wondering what will people think? Or if we are in a circle of friends and the topic turns to certain people...we know we should not gossip or say anything bad. Perhaps even a good deal of sage advice comes to mind. But in that moment, caution does not seem wise and we find ourselves joining in the gossip.

The image of Our Lady of Guadalupe has been carefully studied scientifically over the years. One fascinating item scientists have discovered is that, when they enhance and enlarge Mary's eyes, one can actually see St. Juan Diego. Mary looked directly at Juan Diego when she made her request to him to go and see if the bishop would build a church on Tepeyac Hill. When he was met with skepticism, he went back to Mary, asking that she choose someone else, someone better known than he. Mary, her eyes still on Juan Diego, responded that he was her trusted ambassador. What an expression of confidence!

Further, after Juan Diego got home from seeing the bishop a second time, his uncle was ill. He cared for him all the next day. Concerned he was near death, Juan Diego left to get a priest. Coming up to the hill, Juan began to walk around it, hoping to avoid Mary so that he could complete his important mission. Mary came to him, and when he began to explain why he could not help her, she responded:

Let not your heart be disturbed.
Do not fear any sickness or anguish.
Am I not here, who is your Mother?
Are you not under my protection?
Am I not your health?
Are you not happily within my fold?
What else do you wish?
Do not grieve nor be disturbed by anything.

This is when Juan Diego gathered the roses, taking them to the bishop, convincing him to build the church.

Very carefully consider these words of Mary. She looks at us with the same eyes that looked on Juan Diego. Does she not, then, trust us as well? Are we not under her protection? Do we need anything more than this?

To teach us these truths, the only begotten Son of God descended from His heavenly throne and was born on Christmas Day.

EXPLORING MIGRATION: A FAITH JOURNEY

St. Margaret of Scotland Living Justice Ministry is offering a faith-filled program. What does our faith journey and the Gospel call us to as we experience what is going on with our sisters and brothers in our country regarding refugees, human trafficking and immigration? These are complex issues that are reshaping the cultural, economic, and political landscape of our world and yet we are called to respond in faith with dignity and love.

This eight-session, faith-filled program provides you with a chance to explore immigration, refugees and human trafficking and to discover more about our Catholic teachings, our values, our God, and the millions of people who are on the move in every part of the world.

The program begins with prayer and has time to share, to discuss the readings from the two books in the program, view and discuss videos, talk with special guests and ultimately discern what this means for me as I live my faith-life.
