

FATHER BOB'S COLUMN

TODAY – FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY!

The Holy Family of Mary and Joseph, and the Child Jesus, did not have an easy first year or two together. They had to do a lot of travelling that was not at all routine. Travelling for ordinary people in those days was extremely difficult, to say the least – mostly walking on rocky pathways, occasionally with a donkey to carry one's belongings. There were no motels or restaurants, and often there was the real danger of robbers along the way. The Holy Family journeyed far: from Nazareth to Bethlehem, from Bethlehem to Jerusalem and back again, from Bethlehem to Egypt, and finally from Egypt to Nazareth – all told about 400 miles at least.

After all these difficult journeys, the toddler, Jesus, and his parents were able to settle down to a relatively normal way of life back in Nazareth where Jesus could "grow in wisdom, age, and grace." Just like the Holy Family, our own contemporary family life often has unplanned disruptions and crises too numerous to count. This Feast of the Holy Family encourages us to call upon Mary, Joseph, and Jesus with our family issues. Make an extra effort this week to communicate or relate to each member of your family in a special, holy way. Be a "holy family"!

JANUARY 1ST - "THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD"

For this Holy Day (on a Monday and not a holy day of obligation), we remember Mary as the Mother of God, a special title bestowed upon Mary at the Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D. So what the Council really defined then was that Jesus was both completely human and completely divine – the son of Mary and the Son of God. From this teaching, it followed that Mary was the human mother of the Son of God incarnate. With-in Mary's womb, the mystery of the Incarnation began as the Son of God took on his humanity. That is why we honor Mary on this feast day. <u>Come celebrate at the Eucharist on Sunday, at 4:30pm, December 31st, or Monday, 8am or 10am, January 1st</u>.

JANUARY 1ST – ALSO NEW YEAR'S DAY

The coming of the New Year gives another reason to attend <u>Mass on New Year's Eve at 4:30pm or</u> <u>New Year's Day at 8am or 10am.</u>

Why not make some New Year's Resolutions regarding your spiritual life?

+ Start with Sunday Mass (or Sat. evening). Get a streak going for a month or maybe a "perfect 52" for the year!

+ Add one weekday Mass (7am or 8am) each week as a spiritual bonus opportunity.

+ Pray during a 10 minute (or more) quiet time that you program into your busy day.

+ Read a passage from the Bible every day. (Start with the New Testament.)

+ Find a booklet or electronic site with a religious thought or reflection for each day, and use it.
