

FATHER BOB'S COLUMN

"I'M BACK!"

My knee replacement surgery on Jan. 2nd was successful and recuperation was quicker than I was expecting. I have been doing home-care physical therapy, but now I have switched to out-patient physical therapy to strengthen the new knee even more. Dr. Brian Fissel did such a great job that I am looking forward to the knee being almost as good as new in a couple of months.

In the meantime, I will be happily celebrating the Eucharist with my St. Raphael Parish Family again, but I will be taking some shortcuts for a while until my new knee gets up to full strength. Thank you for your many prayers, cards, and treats; they are all much appreciated by me.

FIRST MAJOR CHURCH PROJECT FROM OUR SRA "FIFTY AND BEYOND" CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

We have signed a contract to <u>refinish and repaint our church pews</u>, and get all <u>new kneelers</u>. (Hurrah! I hear you say.) After meeting with four pew companies from across the Midwest and getting competitive bids, and after consultation with our SRA Finance Council, we chose Wood Renovators from Waupaca, Wisconsin, to redo our pews. We had them here in December to show us what they can do by taking the Deacon's seat to refinish and repaint the ends. (Check it out, if you wish.) When it came back looking terrific, we decided to go ahead with Wood Renovators for this huge project will cost \$100,443. This will include replacing the particle board pew "legs" supporting the center of the pews with solid wood supports that will hold the kneeler brackets more securely.

Thanks to your generosity and prompt payments of your campaign pledges, we have \$103,000 already in hand to pay for this.

The timeframe for this project will be spread out over several months. We will start by removing 18 pews this coming week. We will take these 18 pews out of the two transepts of the church: 9 from the bank of pews next to the music ministry area and 9 from the opposite side in front of the cry room. They will be worked on and then returned by the middle of March, in time for Holy Week, Easter, First Communion, Confirmation, parish jubilee Mass, graduation, weddings and so many other liturgical activities in the busy months of April and May.

Then in June and July, when the demand on the church is less, we will do the pews in the nave of the church, one side at a time. When the pews are finished and returned, all the new kneelers will be installed at one time. Then the plan is to work on new carpet throughout the church and to paint the side walls of the interior of the church.

With all this work going on to renovate our church after its first 50 years, I ask for your patience and continued contributions to the "Fifty and Beyond" Campaign, so that we can do even more to make our outstanding place of worship look new again and ready for another 50 years.

MONDAY, JANUARY 22ND: A DAY OF PRAYER FOR LEGAL PROTECTION OF THE LIFE OF THE UNBORN

Tomorrow many thousands will be gathering in Washington, D.C., and other places to protest against policies of legal abortion in this country. 
