Gospel MT 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. School News

actions of living and non-living things in different ecosystems. Students learned about food webs and explored the unique food webs of various ecosystems through interactive food webs.

Fifth grade investigated various ocean animals on the Active Wild website and documented their findings. Students created Venn diagrams comparing and contrasting the distinguishing characteristics of amphibians and reptiles.

Sixth, 7th, and 8th grades completed a WebQuest tour of the periodic table and documented the unique properties and characteristics of the first fourteen elements of the table. Students are learning how molecules and compounds are formed through covalent and ionic bonding.

Third grade has been working on our Smart-Board making Word Webs. We have been reading GetEpic.com online to build our class caterpillar. We have 4 badges thus far and 400 points. Ms. Polson read us The Little Red Lighthouse and we discussed our school theme, "Your Great Love Will Lead Us Through." Our virtual friend, Mark, joined us dressed as Saint Louis and we took some outdoor photos on the steps of school. In science, Quinn's purple Hot Wheel car won for the yellow pod. The car traveled an average of 289 centimeters during our speed ramp trial. Congratulations! For math, we are plotting coordinates (ordered pairs) points on a grid.

From Ms. Woods English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)

The fourth and fifth grade English classes have just finished the unit on nouns and will soon be

taking the unit test. In the next unit we will be learn-Fourth grade has been learning about the intering about verbs. We will also begin learning how to write a comparison/contrast essay.

> Fourth grade religion, we finished learning about how God strengthens us to be holy. We will be moving on to learn more about how we can show our love for God and others by keeping the Commandments.

> Fourth grade social studies has led us through the conflicts and hardships of the many wars in which the United States has been involved. We have discussed the economic setbacks and recoveries, as well as new challenges we have faced as a country. Students in grade six religion are beginning to learn how the Israelites left Egypt under the leadership of Moses. Eighth grade religion students are continuing their study of the four Marks of the Catholic Church.

In grade six social studies, we are learning about the history and geography of ancient India. Students in grade seven will be completing their study of the English colonies. Fifth grade social studies students are learning about the American Revolution and continue to work on their note-taking skills. Eighth grade students have completed their study of the Industrial Revolution and will begin learning about the Spanish-American War.

On the Epiphany Chalk

This Sunday at Mass, we will bless the chalk for the Feast Day of the Epiphany. This blessed chalk extends a blessing to our homes. When we write the formula of the Epiphany above the main door of our homes, we ask for God's blessings.

The formula for this year is 20+C+M+B+21.

The 20 and 21 at either end of the formula stand for this year, 2021. The letters C, M, and B stand for two things. They first represent the traditional names of the wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Just as these wise men journeyed many miles to visit Christ, we ask God that, as we and our family and friends pass through our doors, we all may find Christ there as well. The second meaning of CMB originates in Latin. CMB stands for three Latin words, *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, which means, "May Christ bless this home."

After the chalk is blessed during Mass, we invite you to take a plastic bag from its place by the doors of the church. Inside, you will find an instruction sheet and a piece of chalk. Use the chalk to write the blessing above the main door of your homes on the inside door trim and say the prayer on the sheet. If your children would like the blessing written above their doors, please do that as well.

This blessing is important each year for our homes. In this time of the pandemic, this blessing is even more important. We have all been spending more time at home. This means work stress has invaded our homes more than normal, arguments have arisen from being cooped up together, and sacramentals have not been nearby to sanctify our homes. Start the year off right by asking God's blessing over your home in this way and inviting His peace to dwell there all year.

We will keep the Epiphany chalk available in the parish office and in the church all week should anyone want to come by and pick some up.
