

FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. STEHLY

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Fr. Bob is enjoying a well-deserved vacation with his brother, Fr. John, and he asked me to share a couple of thoughts in his weekly column while he is gone. I've known Fr. Bob for many years. I grew up in St. Peter Parish in Kirkwood and Fr. Bob and his family moved into that parish while I was still in grade school. When I entered the seminary in 1965 at the old St. Louis Prep Seminary, Fr. Bob was already in the seminary, just beginning his college years. He was ordained in 1973 and I was ordained in 1977. We both celebrated our first Mass at St. Peter Church. Since then I have been assigned to several parishes. My first assignment was to St. Joseph Parish in Manchester, then to St. Sabina Parish in Florissant. I next was assigned to Sts. Joachim and Ann Parish in St. Charles. After three years there, I was assigned as the Vocation Director for the Archdiocese, with residence at the Catholic Student Center at Washington University. I enjoyed that work, but missed parish ministry and eventually was assigned as Pastor of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque Parish in South County. After ten years there, I was assigned as Pastor of Ascension Parish in Chesterfield and spent twelve years there. A year ago I was asked to become Pastor of Ste. Genevieve Parish in Ste. Genevieve, Missouri. I had a wonderful time there, but this past spring, Archbishop Carlson asked me to leave that position to become Vicar General for the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and Moderator of the Curia.

Many have asked what a Vicar General does, including my own family. Basically, I will represent the Archbishop and the Archdiocese when he cannot be present. I will assist him by attending meetings and gatherings of the various agencies and organizations within the Archdiocese. In addition, I will attend Deanery Meetings for Priests and Deacons and, finally, I will be conferring the Sacrament of Confirmation at both Parish and Cathedral celebrations.



My residence is at St. Raphael Rectory and I will be celebrating Mass and being a part of parish life as much as my schedule will permit. I am grateful to Fr. Bob and the staff for the warm welcome they

have given to me. I hope to get to know as many of you as I can in the coming months. I hate to move and I look forward to a long happy stay at your parish. Feel free to contact me if I can be of any service to you.

PROLIFE SENATE BILL SB 5

The Missouri Senate is poised to vote on an historic ProLife bill. On Monday, July 24, the state Senate will consider House-amended SB 5, the strongest ProLife bill in many decades. This legislation will protect the health and safety of women, require unannounced inspections of abortion clinics, ensure that women will hear medical information from a doctor before deciding to obtain an abortion, overturn the St. Louis "abortion sanctuary" ordinance and prohibit other municipalities from passing similar ordinances, and much more. PASTORAL CARE MINISTRY

Last September we introduced you to our newly formed Pastoral Care Ministry and wanted to provide you with a re-cap of how we've progressed and grown:

- Our primary mission is to serve as a bridge to our homebound parishioners to ensure they remain an integral part of our parish family and to provide them with the ability to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist and Anointing of the Sick, on a regular basis
- We have 12 parishioners who have joined us to serve as Ministers
- Currently, we are bringing Communion on a regular basis to 10 parishioners who are unable to attend Mass (in addition to those who were already bringing Communion to our homebound)
- Rides-to-church are being provided by three of our Ministers to bring parishioners who are no longer able to drive themselves to Mass
- The Handyman Ministry program has just been rolled out and is now up and running

We are blessed to have such a faith-filled group of Ministers. How can you assist us?

- Pray for us that we are able to continue to humbly bring the Body of Christ to those who are unable to physically attend Mass with us
- Help us identify those neighbors/parishioners who are no longer able to attend Mass, so we can reach out to see if we can bring Christ to them
- Get the word out to our elderly who might need minor home repairs that we are happy to have our Handyman assist
- Join us as a Minister

We are pleased to introduce you to our newly-formed SRA Handyman Ministry. Its mission is to assist St. Raphael parishioners who need help with small maintenance jobs around their homes that they are unable to complete on their own, such as:

- Changing hard-to-reach light bulbs
- Installing/replacing smoke detectors
- Replacing air filters
- Fixing leaking faucets or running toilets
- Making minor repairs to doors and windows

Our handyman and SRA parishioner, Mr. Don Anderson, can perform minor repairs, diagnose issues that may require a professional, and provide a second opinion. Labor is provided free of charge. Protecting God's Children - Safe Environment Program Compliance

Anyone who works with or volunteers with children must be compliant with the Safe Environment Program of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis set forth by the USCCB. (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) Compliance includes attending a Protecting God's Children Workshop, completing a Worker Registration Form to obtain a background check, and reading and signing a Code of Ethical Conduct. Each location must have copies of individual background checks and code of ethics forms on file for all active volunteers and employees. Additional background checks may be necessary if you have lived out of state in previous years.

To register online for a Protecting God's Children Workshop, please visit www.archstl.org and click on the Protecting God's Children link. You will be redirected to the VIRTUSOnline.org site to complete the registration process. The Code of Ethical Conduct and worker registration forms are available from your parish Child Safety Coordinator and may also be located on your parish website. If you have questions or need assistance with this process, please contact the parish office or the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Program at 314.792.7272.

Missouri Background Checks are obtained when you begin your ministry and are updated every even numbered year. Please let the parish office know if you would like to be removed from the list of active volunteers. You must also contact the Missouri Family Care Safety Registry at 1.866.422.6872 with address changes.
