Church Roof Update

In May, I wrote that the finance committee and I were working on finalizing the replacement of the church roof per the plan laid out in the 50 and Beyond Campaign. These funds have built up to the point that replacement of the roof is financially feasible. As you will recall, these funds are restricted solely for capital campaign expenditures. Thus, there will be no impact to the day-to-day cash flow of the parish.

I am happy to report that a vendor has been selected by our committee. We are now seeking permission of our Apostolic Administrator, Archbishop Carlson, to proceed. As soon as we receive his permission, or the permission of our new Archbishop, we will begin working with the Office of Building and Real Estate to finalize the contract.

More updates I am sure will follow. Please continue to pray and be faithful to the pledges to the 50 and Beyond Campaign.

#### Communion to the Homebound

The Archdiocese has given permission for our homebound parishioners to begin to receive Holy Communion again. These guidelines will be used for these visits:

- The Eucharistic minister must wear a mask at all times.
- Communicants should wear masks, with the exception of the moment of receiving Holy Communion.
- Hand sanitizer should be present and used in the event of any contact.
- Social distancing should be adhered to in all cases outside of distributing Holy Communion.
- Communion should be received only in the hand.

Our pastoral care ministry and I stand ready to help anyone who is staying close to home due to the pandemic and would like to receive Holy Communion. # **Stewardship: The Bible**

Do you want to experience the love, joy, and peace that comes from living a God-centered life? Are you trying to figure out what God is calling you to do with your life? If so, read the Bible, every day. All of the teachings on being a good steward of our gifts come directly from the Gospels, the Old Testament, and the letters of the New Testament.

Stewardship is not a new fad invented by the Church or a word just used by environmentalists. Stewardship is the way God has intended for all of us to live since the beginning of time. The Bible has always been the playbook for living a grateful and generous lifestyle.

The world is filled with many self-improvement books. Fortunately, as Christians, we have the best-selling "self-improvement" book of all-time, the Bible. (Current estimate is five billion sold and counting).

Here's the best part about reading the Bible, not only do you learn about God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit, but you actually grow in love and friendship with the Holy Trinity. The Bible is the living Word of God that speaks to each of us directly in our current circumstances.

Talk to daily Bible readers about their experiences, and they will frequently say that what they read in the Bible pertains to exactly what is going on in their lives at that particular moment. This is not a coincidence. God loves us and knows what we need and when we need it.

In any good, loving relationship, it takes two committed parties. God's commitment is well known. He created us, He gave us an abundance of gifts, He gave us His only Son for our redemption, and He sent the Holy Spirit to guide us today. What about our commitment? All God asks is that we invite Him into our hearts and that we clear a little space for Him to operate in our lives.

A good, loving relationship also requires balance - the appropriate amount of time spent on the appropriate number of things. During this time of pandemic, social injustice, and civil unrest, it is not good to fill up on all the bad news fed to us around the clock. It is also not good to kill time by binge watching a favorite show or reading gossip on social media. If you want to live a virtuous life in a close relationship with our Lord, then balance your day by reading the Bible.

What we put in our minds and hearts affects our thoughts and our actions. If we want good output, we need good input. If we want a good loving relationship with the Holy Trinity and with each other, then we should start with the daily reading of God's Living Word.

Faith is personal, but it is not meant to be private - we are all part of the Body of Christ. If we are unsure or uncomfortable with how to start reading the Bible, we should ask a family member or friend who is a daily Scripture reader for help. Or, we should join a small Bible study group or start one yourself. Local pastors or parish priests would be happy to help. All we have to do is take the first step.

- 1) The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke- Walk with Jesus from His Birth to Ascension!
- 2) The Acts of the Apostles– See the birth and first days of the Church!
- 3) The Book of Tobit-Learn about our patron, St. Raphael the Archangel!




