

Fr. John's Digital Quill for Spiritual Musings and Parish News

This is it!

Since I announced that I was going on a 30-day retreat, I have been humbled by the expressions of understanding and support that I have received. Another question also has come each week...Father, when do you leave?

This Sunday is the day that I leave. I will have limited contact with the parish during the first couple of days, but, by Wednesday of this week, I will be "off the grid" for about a month. The demands of the retreat necessitate me to turn off my cell phone and power down my other electronic devices, unlike some of the other times that I have left the parish. I do appreciate your understanding for me to be out of touch temporarily in these ways.

As this is the case, I do ask that you communicate with the parish and school office for any necessary business while I am gone or with Msgr. Stehly for any sacramental needs. Know of my prayers for the parish as a whole and for the many intentions I am carrying into this retreat.

While on retreat, this column will be a bit different in tone. Instead of more parish business and just a few things on faith, it will change a bit to be more focused on faith.

The 30 Day Retreat

I am going to Creighton University to make the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Ignatius was born a minor noble in Spain in 1491. He dreamed of growing up to be a soldier and win glory in battle. He did become a soldier and went on to fight in the Battle of Pamplona. At the battle, he got hit by a cannonball that broke leg. It was set on the battlefield and he was sent home.

The first setting of the bone, though, left him with a small limp and with a bump that looked unsightly in tights. Yes, tights...that's what the fashionable men of the time wore. So he had the leg rebroken and set at home so it would look right in tights.

While recuperating again, he asked for something to read. He was given a copy of the Life of Christ and Lives of the Saints, the only two books the family owned. With nothing else to do, he read through them. He began to notice that these left him with a satisfied feeling afterward but his daydreams of soldiering and glory did not.

This propelled Ignatius to begin to reexamine his life. After much prayer, he wrote his *Spiritual Exercises* and began to direct people through them.

The Exercises

The exercises are divided into four weeks of prayer. The first reflects on God's love for us. The second dwells on being a disciple of Christ. The third and fourth weeks journey from the Last Supper through the Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus.

The exercises call the retreatant to pray four hours a day. Each hour is focused on a particular passage from scripture. In this passage, the person encounters Christ in some way and the hour gives time to pray through what Christ is saying in the passage and how it affects one's life. One of the items that has struck people is that the exercises are silent. We do not talk at meals or gather for regular conferences or watch the evening news. Instead, we gather daily for Mass and also meet with a spiritual director once per day who will reflect with us where God has been in that day and how we can continue to walk forward with Him in the day ahead. You can be sure, then, I am glad the Stanley Cup Finals are over!

Outside of the times for prayer, meals, direction, and Holy Mass, the time is ours to do with as we please. Typically, I will fall into a pattern of the day on retreat just as I do here. But, it is up to me. I can pray, or take a walk, or nap, or read something that may give some insight into how God is working.

People have also asked if I am locked in at Creighton for 30 days and prohibited from leaving? No. We are free to leave the campus to take a walk or visit a nearby quiet spot to pray. It is also possible to walk to Iowa if we want to get really far away. But I will be mostly on campus for the whole month.

Again, please know of my prayers as I leave for retreat! Please pray for me too! Fr. John #SRAstrong
