Reading I

2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled."

In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

Gospel (Continued)

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.



Spring Break

This week, our students and teachers will enjoy a much-deserved Spring Break. Please keep them in your prayers for a refreshing and safe time away from the classroom.

As a reminder, due to Spring Break, there will be no 8:00am Mass this week.

8:00am Mass

Beginning with the end of Spring Break on March 22, we will resume the 8:00am Mass in Church. Two grades will come to church each day and will sit socially distanced from one another in the main section and cry room sections of the church.

Members of the parish are welcome to attend these Masses as well. We ask, however, that you only sit on the choir side of the church to minimize contact with our students.

We will also extend the 8:00am Mass to Fridays through the rest of the school year. We are doing this in part to give our students more exposure to attending Mass in person again. Additionally, we are not yet comfortable resuming our Friday prayer services as a school community, and want to continue having community prayer at the beginning of each school day.

Penance Service

Our parish penance service is fast approaching! Please mark your calendars to visit church on Saturday, March 27, from 2:00-4:20pm to receive the Sacrament of God's Mercy. This is a great way to complete the Lenten journey and be more fully prepared to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection on Easter.

Thank you to the numerous families who responded to the survey on an outdoor Mass on Easter. We had a great response and I appreciate the input.

We will have, weather permitting, an Easter Sunday outdoor Mass on Easter Sunday, April 4, at noon. This was the overwhelming time choice for this Mass. This Mass will work a bit differently from the others last year. We will have a seating area in the first section of parking spots for families who would like to bring lawn chairs. Behind them and in the other parking areas we will allow cars to park. Please note that anyone choosing to sit outside a vehicle must wear a mask.

Church Roof Update
