

FATHER BOB'S COLUMN

THE ST. RAPHAEL PARISH MISSION FOR LENT IS NOW !!!

We welcome <u>Father George Knab</u>, a Missionary Oblate of Mary Immaculate (O.M.I.) from Belleville, Illinois, who is preaching at all the Masses this weekend to urge us to be renewed in the life of Christ by participating in <u>special services that begin</u> <u>Sunday evening at 7:00pm</u>.

The <u>Sacrament of Reconciliation</u> (confession) will be offered on <u>Monday even-</u> ing, and on the following day, <u>Tuesday</u>, each hour on the hour from 10am to 4pm. A complete schedule for the week is found in this bulletin on Page 9.

Father George Knab, O.M.I., born the oldest of eight siblings in Buffalo, New York, joined the Oblates of Mary Immaculate and was ordained a priest in 1967. The Oblates are a world-wide religious community of nearly 4,000 members, founded in

1826 by St. Eugene de Mazenod to preach the Gospel to the poor. He has worked as an Oblate priest in Buffalo, Indianapolis, South Carolina, then Mexico and Brazil, Washington, D.C. preaching throughout the East Coast, then parish work in Florida, Massachusetts and Louisiana. In 2003, he became part of the Oblate Preaching Ministries based in Chicago; from there he conducted 130 parish missions across the country. In 2013, he moved to Belleville, near Our Lady of the Snows Shrine. Whenever he is home and not out preaching in parishes, he does Bible Studies on Mondays, and works in a soup kitchen in East St. Louis.

And thus you can see, we are privileged to have a man with much experience in preaching throughout our country, and even in other parts of the world. Let yourself be blessed by his wisdom and the Lord's presence in these five days of our Parish Mission at St. Raphael Parish this week.

FIRST FULL WEEK OF LENT



Do you have a plan for getting back into shape for the great Easter Season? Don't forget the <u>three</u> tried and true spiritual exercises: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

- 1. <u>Prayer</u> morning prayer, night prayer, rosary, reading the Bible, meditation, solitude time, spiritual reading, daily Mass, prayer with the family/children, prayer before meals in restaurants, prayer when driving, Stations of the Cross on Fridays, Tuesday afternoon Bible study or the Tuesday evening "The Wild Goose" video series about the Holy Spirit, ...
- 2. <u>Fasting</u> sacrifice your favorite beverage or smoking, sacrifice eating between meals, give up TV time or internet time in the evening, eat out less and cook more for family, give up some recreational time to visit someone who needs you., ...
- <u>Almsgiving</u> Lenten Rice Bowl for CRS, our SRA Lenten Project to "Buy a Van," St. Vincent de Paul Society, your favorite charity, open your door or your heart to someone who needs your help, ...

HOW IS THE R.C.I.A. COMING ALONG, YOU ASK?

Today at 10am Mass we have the Ritual of Sending for the two participants of this year's R.C.I.A.; later on Sunday evening, they will go to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election with the Archbishop and a few hundred other potential new members of the Catholic Church from a variety of other parishes. Chrystal Montgomery is looking forward to being baptized, confirmed and receiving first Eucharist at the Easter Vigil; Karol Bick is planning on making her Profession of Faith as a Catholic, then being confirmed and receiving first Eucharist. Dear St. Raphael School Families and Parishioners,

It's hard to believe that Lent has begun, but here we are! I hope that many of you will take advantage of the opportunity to renew your faith and parish community this coming week by attending the SRA Parish Mission. It truly promises to be a time of inspiration and hope!

Our school community is eagerly participating in the parish Lenten project to "Buy a Van" for the Queen of Peace Center (QOPC). Our first step was to use our annual Mission Carnival as the initial fundraiser for the project. The Mission Carnival is like a fun fair at the end of the school day on Fat Tuesday, with games of skill and chance going on in each classroom. Students purchase tickets ahead of time and then partner up to walk around the building and play games of their choice for about an hour, and win lots of donated kitschy little prizes that they love. The most popular stop is usually face painting with a line out the door! At the end of Mission Carnival, we collect all the unused tickets and put them into a raffle for gift cards to local popular spots. Many thanks to the parent volunteers, teachers, and prize donors for organizing and carrying out this fun event for a good cause!

Our 7th Graders visited QOPC on Friday, March 3rd, to learn more about the mission of the Center, and to interact with some of the children whose mothers receive services there. After our 7th Graders came back, we created an all-school fund-raising project to help "Buy a Van" and then to raise money specifically to help the children at QOPC. Stay tuned for more details.

We are busy making plans for next school year already and will be adding a full-time Reading and Math Intervention Teacher to our faculty. I will begin advertising for this position very soon; but, if you know of a dedicated teacher with reading and math specialization for struggling students, please ask him or her to contact me at vangel@straphaelarchangel.org. We have found some of our best teachers and staff through your connections, so please help us out again if you can.

On a bittersweet note, our Recess Coordinator, Mrs. Angela Cierpiot has notified me that she will be leaving her position at SRA effective Friday, March 17th. Angela has been discerning how to re-enter the business world and now has a wonderful opportunity to do so. We will miss her consistent presence and guidance at our recess times, and we thank her so much for her service to our school. As one parent recently emailed me, "I just wanted to drop you a note to tell you how much I appreciate Angela and the role she plays at recess. I couldn't understand her role when it was announced; but, now that I've done recess duty a few times, I see the benefit of having a CONSISTENT adult out there every day. She gets to know our kids and therefore she can monitor bullying and unkindness. She sees what the kids need and can intercede for them (new balls, soccer nets, etc.). And the sacrifice she makes by being there! Anyway- thank you for having her there. I hope she stays." We hope to find a replacement for Angela as our Recess Coordinator for the remainder of this school year as well as moving forward.
