Reading I

In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them. For I, the LORD, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting punishment for their fathers' wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments. "You shall not take the name of the LORD, your God, in vain. For the LORD will not leave unpunished the one who takes his name in vain. "Remember to keep holy the sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slave, or your beast, or by the alien who lives with you. In six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the LORD has blessed the sabbath day and made it holy. "Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the LORD, your God, is giving you. You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his male or female slave, nor his ox or ass, nor anything else that belongs to him."

"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need any-one to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

Scrutiny

For the next three weeks, our catechumen Nick, will be participating in what are called the scrutinies. Thanks to his work schedule, this will take place at a different Mass each week, so if you regularly attend one of the Masses, you will get to see one of the scrutinies.

The scrutiny has two parts to it.

The first is to scrutinize. In the early Church, this would be an in-depth examination by the local bishop to assess a catechumen's growth in the different areas of faith. Today, it is a much briefer rite, encouraging the catechumen to continue to bring forward his questions and his weaknesses so that Christ may touch him with His transformative grace.

The second is an exorcism. We do not do this because we believe him to be possessed. Rather, it is akin to the exorcism at the Baptism of an infant. By this prayer, we are asking God to deliver him from anything not of God so that he may be fully a person of the light.

The scrutiny will take place after the homily. We invite you to listen and to pray this rite for Nick as he prepares to enter the Church at Easter.


Weekly Devotion for the Year of St. Joseph
