### FR. JOHN'S DIGITAL QUILL FOR SPIRITUAL MUSINGS AND PARISH NEWS

#### Pope Francis and Civil Unions

Last month, headlines began to emerge on Catholic news websites that the Holy Father was changing Church teaching on civil unions for samesex couples. Here, I want to address the controversy and the recent statement of clarification from the Vati- Laetiia that persons with same-sex attractions are to can.

The controversy originated with a documentary film about the Holy Father called, "Francesco." In this film, there is a 20-second clip in which the Holy Father supposedly states about persons with samesex attractions and civil unions, "You can't kick someone out of a family, nor make their life miserable for this. What we have to have is a civil union law; that way they are legally covered." This comment seems to say that the Church is for civil unions for same-sex couples.

However, a recent letter from the Vatican has brought clarification to this comment. The filmmakers took the answers to two separate questions, spliced them together, and presented them as one quote without respecting the context of either answer.

The first sentence of the quote is reflective of current Church teaching. In Amoris Laetitia, the Holy Father affirms the difficulty that exists at times between parents and children who experience same-sex attraction. In spite of this difficulty, the Pope and the synod teaches,

> We would like before all else to reaffirm that every person, regardless of sexual orientation, ought to be respected in his or her dignity and treated with consideration, while 'every sign of unjust discrimination' is to be carefully avoided, particularly any form of aggression and violence (250).

The next part of the quote comes from a different question. In this question, the Holy Father is asked if he has become more liberal on same-sex marriage due to the work of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Father, while acknowledging the grace of the Spirit, affirmed that it is incongruous to speak of same-sex marriage. After this, he affirmed that same-sex couples in civil unions should have civil protections.

The question is, what does Pope Francis mean

by civil unions?

In 2003, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued a document concerning civil unions and marriage for same-sex couples. This document affirms what was taught by Pope Francis in Amoris be respected. This respect, however, cannot in any way imply approval of same-sex marriage or civil unions.

So the Church has taught that civil marriages or civil unions akin to marriage are not acceptable. In clarifying the comments of Pope Francis, the Vatican referred to an interview Pope Francis gave in 2014. In this interview, the Holy Father states,

> Marriage is between a man and a woman. The secular states want to justify civil unions to regulate different situations of coexistence, moved by the need to regulate economic aspects between persons as, for example, to ensure health care. They are coexistence pacts of a different nature, of which I wouldn't be able to give a list of the different forms. It's necessary to look at the different cases and to evaluate them in their variety.

According to this understanding, the Holy Father is looking at civil unions not as something akin to marriage, but instead as a civil device to regulate economic activity within a state. Such a union would be different from marriage and would fit into a place where the Church would see it as a civil matter and outside of her competency to comment on.

Such an understanding would fall in line with the teachings of former Pontiffs. In response to a 1997 law in San Francisco legalizing same-sex marriage, Cardinal Levada, who was chosen by Pope Benedict XVI to succeed him at the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, allowed health care benefits to be extended to a person living with an Archdiocesan employee, regardless of his/her status. If Pope Benedict saw this decision as contrary to the 2003 teaching he wrote on such a critical issue, then why would he choose Cardinal Levada to follow him at the CDF? There is here, then, no real controversy. The Holy Father's comments are in line with Church teaching. Pope Francis continues to try to articulate a teaching for persons with same-sex attractions that is authentic to the magisterium while encouraging these persons to continue to practice the Catholic faith.

May we continue to pray for the Holy Father daily as he exercises his office of leading the Church closer to Our Lord.
