Brothers and sisters: None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

MT 16:21-27 Gospel

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage, and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When that servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' Falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! A Tweet from Pope Francis

Mary, the Mother who cared for Jesus, cares with maternal affection and pain also for this wounded world.

On September 8, the Feast of the Birth of Mary, Pope Francis tweeted the above. It gives rich insight into the identity of Mary and her status as a model for us as well.

Mary was born with a specific vocation: to be the Mother of Jesus. On December 8, we remember this vocation did not begin with her birth, but existed even in her conception. Mary was born free from sin and was given every necessary grace to be the Mother of Jesus.

When God made each of us, He had a specific purpose and vocation in mind. While it may take us some time to discover what it is (and we may not have an angel show up to tell us), God has given us the necessary graces to fulfill the vocation He has en-

A week after we celebrate Mary's birth, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. The close connection between these feasts highlights the connection between these two identities of Mary. Mary Jesus left home she had no further role to play. Rather, she walked with her Son during His public ministry and was there with Him as He hung upon the cross.

Our vocations will at times bring us into periods of suffering. We may run from it, ignore it, or pretend it is not there. But the suffering has a specific purpose: to help us to grow in our vocation, our God given calling, to become the people He has called us to be.

Without having been there at the cross, part of Mary's motherhood would be unfulfilled. Often times, after suffering, we find that we would not be the people we are without it.

God does not just let us suffer on our own and hope we make it. He sends us helpers. Among them is our Mother Mary. When suffering comes, may we turn to her, cling to her, and ask her help that we may grow through it!
