Permission Forms for Confirmation Sponsors and Godparents

Every year towards the beginning of the school year, I like to publish a couple of reminders about how to get forms to be a Confirmation Sponsor or a Godparent signed by me.

These letters are not a *pro forma* matter. They are me saying that I know the person to be a faith-filled, practicing Catholic who is prepared to assume this office. I take this responsibility very seriously.

Thus, I ask that these forms be brought by the sponsor or Godparent to a Saturday evening or Sunday Mass. After Mass, I will be happy to meet with you briefly to have a conversation about the role you are about to assume and to sign the form. Forms dropped off at the office, faxed, or e-mailed will not be signed and will be returned with a reminder of this policy. College students who attend school away from St. Louis are asked to see if the priest where they attend Mass will sign the form. If the priest will not sign it, they should submit it to me along with a letter explaining their faith practice while in college.

Finally, these forms are normally handed out by the parish or school well before the ceremony. I greatly appreciate your getting this form and bringing it to Mass in a timely manner. Exceptions may be made for exceptional circumstances but should never be assumed.

Is the Our Father Changing?

Recently, the parish council asked me this question. The short answer is no.

Pope Francis has proposed changing the petition in the Our Father, "and lead us not into temptation," to "and do not abandon us to temptation." His point in making such a proposal is to emphasize what is already implicit in the text. It is the Devil that tempts us. God the Father never leads us into temptation but walks with us through the time of temptation.

The media was very excited this summer as this proposal seemed to gain steam. The French Bishops had decided to change the wording in the Mass and, at the urging of the Pope, the Italian Bishops followed suit.

The decision to change Mass texts ultimately rests with the local conference of bishops. At the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops meet-

ing in June, a bishop did bring up this change in the Our Father. He asked if the United States had to change and the answer was no, unless there was interest from the floor. No bishop rose to add to the conversation or to make a motion about it.

Among priests and bishops, the general consensus seems to be that the Mass text changes from eight years ago are still being absorbed by the people and the clergy. There is little stomach at the USCCB or in the local clergy to make changes unless they are absolutely necessary.

I really do not think, then, that we need to be concerned about a change for quite some time, if at all.

Extraordinary Ministers of Communion

As a result of our recent stewardship drive in Lent, we did get some new lectors for Mass, for which I am grateful. We did not, however, have any new individuals express a desire to be Extraordinary Ministers of Communion.

Such a choice is definitely one that needs to be made after much prayer and thought. I encourage anyone who has thought about or prayed about being an Extraordinary Minister to give it more thought and prayer and to contact the parish office if you are interested. Training is quick and easy and we can schedule you for the Mass you normally attend.

October: Respect Life Month

This month, as a community of faith, we will pray for and act with greater respect for life from conception to natural death.

St. Raphael has a very active Pro-Life group that is constantly adding new facets to its work. We will sponsor a second time at Planned Parenthood in November and our school is beginning to form a new Students for Life Club.

Of particular interest next Sunday is the Life Chain. Life Chain is a silent witness to the dignity of life as cars and pedestrians pass by. Next Sunday afternoon, we invite you to stand with us in front of Catholic Supply to witness that all life is precious.

Also please remember that October is Mary's month as well! How will you remember Mary our Mother this month?

Mrs. Amanda Knauer, Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: We have had a fantastic start to the new school year! The students are getting back into the school routine. During religion class, the focus has been on how Jesus worships and how we can imitate Him. In math, our attention has been on place value and being able to compare and round numbers. During literature, the students have been working on summarizing, determining theme, and identifying cause and effect.

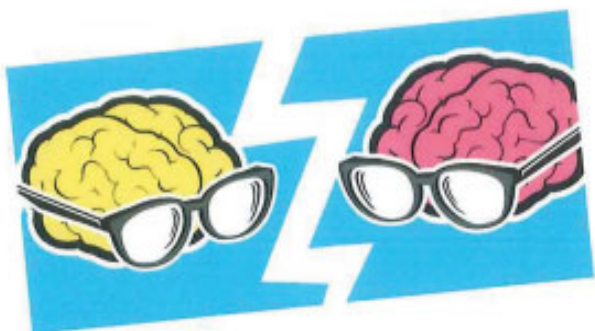
