Reading I

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and staved in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her"? His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

Reminders with Phase II Protocols

This weekend will be our first Sunday Masses Parish Council Nomination Form using the Phase II re-opening protocols. A few reminders of what will be different this weekend:

- Our maximum number of people in Mass has increased from 170 to 350 persons. If we run out of spots in the open pews, ushers may seat people in the roped off pews in a socially distant manner.
- Holy Communion may now be received • on the tongue. To receive Communion this way, you must approach Msgr. Stehly or Fr. John and we ask that you come up for Communion at the end of the line.
- Due to the increase in the number of per-• sons able to attend Mass, the Noon Mass will be canceled starting on Sunday, July 12.

Outside of Holy Mass, the existing practices remain essentially the same. Any parish or school meetings may be held if the number of those in attendance is 10 people or lower and the group has received permission from Fr. John or Mrs. Hayes to meet.

Social events remain postponed. If groups would like to have social events, they need to speak with me and plan on wearing masks and allow six feet between persons for the entire event. These policies are for both indoor and outdoor activities.

The parish council develops and implements the parish mission statement. The council also sets and helps to implement key goals and objectives for the parish. The members also help to coordinate the activities of the different committees and organizations of the parish.

Most recently, the parish council has been very helpful in being a conduit of communication between the parish and me during the Coronavirus. It has also been an invaluable sounding board for ideas during the time of the shutdown.

Thank you to our council for its service to our parish and I pray you will consider joining the council.

DO YOU WANT TO ADDRESS RACISM BUT DON'T KNOW WHERE TO BEGIN?


Faith & Racial Equity: Exploring Power & Privilege is an 8-week module that awakens groups to the economic systems, public policies, cultural norms, and hidden biases that empower some and oppress others. The first half of the module introduces a framework for understanding and recognizing racial disparities in power and privilege. Sessions 5-8 take a deeper dive into specific issues related to power and privilege, including affirmative action, the school-to-prison pipeline, the criminal justice system, and powerful biases in media representation. As with all JustFaith programs, participants will explore how their faith should inform their response to their learning, as well as discern action steps for working toward racial equity in their own communities.

Please note that Faith and Racial Equity is not for the faint of heart! The module is designed for participants who are willing to wrestle with hard questions and take an honest look at their own attitudes, assumptions, and choices. However, through spiritual grounding and community-building, participants find support and belonging throughout their journey to personal transformation and social action.

Please join me for this 8-week exploration of Faith & Racial Equity. The class will be offered through Zoom on Tuesday evenings from 6:30 - 9:00 beginning July 7 through September 1, (no class on July 28). The cost is \$50.00 and includes all materials for the class.
