

Palm Sunday and Holy Week

The holiest of weeks opens with Palm Sunday as a special gateway into the Paschal Mystery, the celebration of the redemptive act of Jesus Christ. All over the world, Catholics are hearing the story of the Passion and Death of Jesus as we carry palm branches, symbolic of saints entering the kingdom of God. While the residents of ancient Jerusalem cast them on the ground before Jesus, we hold ours as a reminder of our call to follow Christ on His journey.

Some would minimize the week by seeing the events as separate actions unrelated, but that is a disservice to faith. The suffering of Jesus at the hands of His persecutors is intimately connected to His victory of resurrection. The sharing of His Eucharist at the Last Supper is an act of preparation of all disciples in all ages to be assured of His enduring presence among us. The act of dying upon the cross opens access to eternal life for us all, as He conquers death in His rising in the flesh to eternal life.

I encourage you to participate as fully as possible in the holy days of this week, especially Holy Thursday's Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday's Service of the Passion, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. These days hold up to us the glory of God's salvation.

The Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday) will be celebrated at both churches.

What to do with palms

Now that you have palm fronds, some have asked what to do with them. An old custom was to place them behind the crucifix you have in your home as a reminder of our participation in the Sacrifice of Christ. Then, next year as we prepare for Lent, return the old palm to church for proper disposal (burning) and replace it with next year's palm. Don't have a crucifix in the home? Catholic Supply has a wonderful collection, or perhaps ask older relatives for one that may have family history. The crucifix that hung above my parents' bed is now hanging at my sister's home as a reminder of their love and faith.
