

Fr. Molini's Notes

I am the vine...

Our Gospel this weekend draws our attention to the imagery of the vine and the branches. How edifying to consider the intimacy with which Christ seeks to unite Himself to us, as connected as a vine to a branch, one dependent on the other. A grape vine produces fruit on new growth, and the new growth relies on the existing branch that nourishes and supports the new growth. Connected to Christ, we rely upon His Eucharistic nourishment to produce the goodness of God. We rely on His support to spread His word and works, but, separated from Him, we are doomed to the withering effects of daily life.

May we allow the call of Christ to discipleship to be a call to unity. May we seek always to be connected in love to Jesus and His Church, established by Christ to continue His ministry of grace.

Over the prior 6 months, the Pastoral Council undertook to write down a statement of it's purpose in order to help with the recruitment of new members. The process of developing a written statement of purpose (our discussions and reflections) was, for us, a renewal of what we are called to do for the parish. Under the direction of Fr. Molini, the Pastoral Council will encourage all parish organizations to create similar statements for themselves and to consider how they assist their members place Jesus at the center of their lives. The new title for our organization, Pastoral Council, reflects that we help lead toward pastoral goals for the parish, to administer and to care for one another, and to lead all to Christ. Pastoral Council

Purpose

St. Raphael the Archangel's Pastoral Council promotes dialogue among parishioners to assist the Pastor in his leadership role toward fulfilling the mission of Jesus Christ.

Who We Are

Pastoral Council members consist of parishioners committed to prayer, whose lives actively reflect their Catholic Faith, especially by weekly attendance at Saturday evening or Sunday Mass. Members commit to growing to be more like Christ though service to the parish.

Members provide input on topics at Pastoral Council meetings, volunteer at various parish and school functions and are visible and approachable to parishioners to foster greater communication among all aspects of parish life, being respectful of confidentiality.

Service on Council

After a proper period of discernment and prayer, and being led by the Holy Spirit, candidates called to serve from among parishioners by sitting members of Pastoral Council, are presented to the Pastor for appointment to the Council.

Members of Pastoral Council are asked to serve for a three-year term beginning in January. Each year, three new candidates shall be appointed to the Council. Appointments should overlap such that new members are consistently appointed to the seats of members whose terms expire. The Council consists of nine (9) members, and the Pastor, who serves in an ex officio capacity as head of Pastoral Council.

What We Do

Members of the Pastoral Council serve as advisors to the Pastor. Members advice may include areas of pastoral development, financial matters, effectiveness of programs and organizations, contribute to the annual report, and general parish concerns.

Members also serve as a resource to parishioners and parish organizations to bring matters to the Pastoral Council for consideration.

The members of the Pastoral Council may also be asked to help parishioners and parish organizations to deepen their faith and build the community through supporting parish efforts in these areas. (Continued on Page 7.)

Members are asked to share with parishioners the efforts of the Pastoral Council for broader input. Members are also encouraged to speak with parish organizations, serving as a resource for them in fostering greater communication and fostering deeper fulfillment of our mission as a Catholic parish community.

Offices of the Pastoral Council

From time to time, members of the Council shall serve in leadership offices. There shall be an office of president, vice president and secretary. All other members of the Council serve *at-large* to promote dialogue with the entire parish and among parish organizations. The responsibilities of officers of the Council are:

President. The president shall serve at the appointment of the Pastor and shall be responsible for organizing and presiding at Council meetings. The president shall present an agenda each meeting, having consulted the Pastor. Members are urged to offer topics for the agenda.

Vice President. The vice president shall serve at the appointment of the Pastor and shall assist the president with organizing Council meetings, and shall preside at Council meetings where the president is not in attendance.

Secretary. The secretary shall serve at the appointment of Pastor and shall be responsible for recording discussions during Council meetings and to provide minutes of meetings to the members. The secretary shall retain such minutes for the benefit of Council.

At-large members. At-large members shall attend Council meetings, receive minutes of meetings, and provide such input and counsel as necessary to fulfill the purpose of the Council. All members are entitled to place matters on an agenda for meetings, upon consultation with the president and Pastor.

Meetings

Pastoral Council shall meet at such times as may be convenient and necessary to fulfill the purpose of the Council, and at the direction of the Pastor. Under regular circumstances, the Pastoral Council shall meet in person six times annually, at such time and location as shall be directed by the Pastor in consultation with the president. Council may choose to not to meet at given times upon proper notice to, and consultation with, members.

Meeting Time: TBD Meeting location: Fireplace Room, Parish Office Lower Level

Also, given the current configuration of pastoral leadership, a joint meeting with the Pastoral Council of St. Gabriel the Archangel Parish is recommended and encouraged once or twice a year to foster inter-parish cooperation and show a unity among Catholics in the St. Louis Hills area.

Scholarship Program through Saint Louis Hills Neighborhood Association

The St. Louis Hills Neighborhood Association provides two one-time scholarships per year in the amount of \$750 for applicants on the basis of scholarship, leadership, and service in school, church, and community. Membership in the St. Louis Hills Neighborhood Association (SLHNA) is an excellent way to contribute to the camaraderie of our beautiful neighborhood. Another great benefit of membership is eligibility for our annual scholarship competition. An exciting update to the program begins this year!

In order to best serve our community, we are expanding the applicant pool for the 2024-2025 academic year. Now, a child or legal dependent of a SLHNA member is eligible to apply based upon the following criteria:

- the member lives within the boundaries of St. Louis Hills;
- the member's household has two current and consecutive years of paid SLHNA membership;
- the applicant is at least an eighth grade student;
- the applicant is attending or planning to attend an educational institution (public high school, private high school, trade school, technical school, vocational school, two-year college, four-year college, university, and so forth).

Two one-time scholarships of \$750 will be awarded. The Scholarship Chairs will receive completed applications. Personal information will be redacted. The redacted applications will then be reviewed by a panel of judges, who will select two scholarship recipients. The two recipients selected by the judges will be contacted directly by email by May 29, 2024. Updates to the Association's website and social media will also announce the selected recipients. The monetary award will be distributed by September 15, 2024, and made payable to each recipient's educational institution, not to the recipient directly.

Each applicant must:

- complete the application found on the Association's website;
- provide a list of any academic honors and/or extracurricular activities;
- independently write and submit an essay of 150 words or less which addresses the question "How has living in St. Louis Hills shaped you as a person?";
- provide a 3rd quarter/2nd trimester report card;
- submit two three reference letters.

The application deadline is April 26, 2024. The completed application and related documents must be post-marked by that date. No electronic submissions will be considered. We ask that the selected applicants provide a recent picture for our newsletter and attend the June 2024 SLHNA meeting to receive award certificates.
