

Entrance Antiphon Cf. Ps 86 (85): 3, 5

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you.

Reading 1 Sir 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God. What is too sublime for you, seek not, into things beyond your strength search not. The mind of a sage appreciates proverbs, and an attentive ear is the joy of the wise. Brothers and sisters: You have not approached that which could be touched and a blazing fire and gloomy darkness and storm and a trumpet blast and a voice speaking words such that those who heard begged that no message be further addressed to them. No, you have approached Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and countless angels in festal gathering, and the assembly of the firstborn enrolled in heaven, and God the judge of all, and the spirits of the just made perfect, and Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and the sprinkled blood that speaks more eloquently than that of Abel.

Gospel Lk 14:1, 7-14

On a sabbath Jesus went to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees, and the people there were observing him carefully. He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. Rather, when you are invited, go and take the lowest place so that when the host comes to you he may say, 'My friend, move up to a higher position.' Then you will enjoy the esteem of your companions at the table. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Then he said to the host who invited him, "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment. Rather, when you hold a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be because of their inability to repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

One of the main principles of living a stewardship lifestyle is to give without expecting anything in return. This is difficult for some to comprehend in the "consumerist" culture we live in. This is even difficult for many parish communities that have become heavily dependent on parish fundraising events to support the mission and ministry of their local parish. Generally speaking, at a parish fundraiser, we pay money and receive something in return; it's just a financial transaction. This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where we unite our sacrifices with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

The Archdiocese of St. Louis is committed to preventing abuse and assisting those who are affected by incidents of abuse. Stewardship Reflection from David Baranowski, Director of Parish Stewardship & Leadership Formation Archdiocese of St. Louis

We are about one year into the Archdiocese of St. Louis' strategic planning initiative called "All Things New." In a couple of months listening sessions will be held with all parishes to begin the discussion of future parish models. Regardless of what the new future parish structure will be, there are still things that we need to continue to do today, in the present moment, until any reallocation of resources begins. Let's not get caught up in looking too far into the future that it paralyzes us from carrying on the mission and ministry of our church right now.

We still need to pray both individually and collectively. Privately, we need to reflect upon our need for Jesus and call upon the Holy Spirit to guide our thoughts, words, and actions in our daily interactions. As a community, we need to continue vibrant celebrations of Holy Mass and the sacraments.

We still need to participate in ministry. We are called to discern our charisms, our gifts from the Holy Spirit, and use them to help continue to build God's kingdom on earth. We are called to minister to those who are in need spiritually, physically, and economically. We are called to minister to those parishioners who are helping those in need. We are still called to "go and make disciples."

We still need to be generous with our money. Yes, there has been a freeze on capital improvements at our parish facilities, but we are still called to financially support our local parishes, our larger Church of St. Louis, and our greater Church world-wide. Generosity doesn't take a break just because we don't know where we'll be celebrating Mass a year from now.

"All Things New" is about our own personal transformation, our individual change of heart, and not just about where my new parish will be. "All Things New" is our opportunity to move out of our comfortable surroundings and commit to a new relationship with the Holy Trinity and each other. "All Things New" is an opportunity to dream about what is possible, to discover new ministry opportunities and not just stand pat with the status quo.

Some people are skeptical that the Archdiocese has the new parish realignment already figured out. But, I can tell you that is not the case. The Archdiocesan leadership team is set on "implementing a vision for evange-lization that empowers and expects every baptized Catholic to spread the Gospel message and ensures a Catholic presence in every square mile of the Archdiocese of St. Louis." The upcoming listening sessions are a tremendous opportunity for each of us to provide input. But, it will require each of us to open our hearts and minds, and to set aside our pride and ego.

To prepare for the listening sessions of "All Things New" ask yourself these questions. What do I truly believe in? Am I willing to change for Jesus? How is God calling me to respond at this moment?
