

READINGS FOR AUGUST 8, 2021 NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I 1 Kgs 19:4-8

Elijah went a day's journey into the desert, until he came to a broom tree and sat beneath it. He prayed for death saying: "This is enough, O Lord! Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. Elijah looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water. After he ate and drank, he lay down again, but the angel of the Lord came back a second time, touched him, and ordered, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb.



Ropes in Church

With our students and teachers returning to the classroom this week, we have decided to remove the ropes from the pews in church. Hopefully, this change will allow us to resume having Masses together as a school community.

Now that the ropes are down, we do ask that you continue to socially distance when coming to Mass. For instance, if people are seated in a pew, consider sitting with a pew in between you or, if necessary, sit behind them, but move down the pew away so that you are not directly behind them.

Mask Mandate

I am aware that there are legal challenges pending to the St. Louis City mask mandate. There are similar challenges pending in court regarding the St. Louis County mask mandate.

As of writing this article on Wednesday morning, the Saint Louis City mask mandate is still in effect, while a judge has issued a restraining order against the enforcement of the mask mandate in the County.

This is a fluid situation with these mandates and things can change rapidly. We do ask, in addition to watching the news, that you keep an eye on Flocknotes as well. I am doing my best to stay on top of the news and will publish updates as soon as I can via Flocknotes should there be a change to the mask mandate in St. Louis City.

8:00am Mass Returns

This Friday, August 13, will be our first 8:00am Mass of the new school year. We will have Mass five days per week at this time. When it is deemed safe for the students to resume prayer services on Fridays, we will go back to daily Mass four days per week.

As was our practice in the fourth quarter of last Please remember that everyone coming to Mass year, we ask all adults to wear masks when at this Mass. We also ask all those attending Mass who are not in our school community to sit only on the choir side of the church.

School resumes this Thursday. As I write this column, our enrollment numbers are continuing to adjust, but we look to open with the same or greater enrollment in our kindergarten-8th grade program. 
Our Parish Mission Statement

RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a process the Catholic Church has developed for people who are interested in finding out about the Church and might want to become Catholic. Think of it as being similar to purchasing a home. You research homes, prices, neighborhoods, etc., when house hunting and only make a decision to purchase a house after spending a lot of time in preparation and consultation with others. That is what RCIA offers - explanations of what and why Catholics believe and do what we do.

South City Deanery PSR provides formal Catholic religious education (Grade 1 to Confirmation prep) for the children in parishes of the South City Deanery. Sessions are on Monday evenings, September through May, from 6:20-7:40pm. Our program continues and supplements the religious formation from parents, who are the first teachers of their children in the ways of the faith. We assist families in the areas of knowledge of the faith, beliefs and Christian life skills and religious practices, and strengthening the growing relationship with Jesus and his Church. Registration for 2021-2022 South City Deanery PSR year will be held on:

August 15 (Sunday) from 11:00am to 1:00 pm in the Cafeteria at St. John the Baptist Parish August 23 (Monday) from 6:00 – 8:00pm in the St. John the Baptist Parish Center

First Reconciliation and First Communion are usually done as part of the 2nd grade curriculum.
