## Highlights from Seek 2023 by David Baranowski

St. Louis hosted the SEEK23 Conference at the Convention Center the week of January 2, 2023. The conference was sponsored by the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS). Over 17,000 people from around the world were in attendance! The conference was attended by thousands and thousands of college students; hundreds of priests, seminarians, and religious ordered men and women; dozens of bishops; and hundreds of Catholic men and women. The days were filled with morning Mass, workshops, dynamic speakers, sacramental and worship opportunities, and entertainment - all to encourage an encounter with Jesus. It was a week packed with fun, fellowship and faith. Here are some of the workshop highlights:

Making Missionary Disciples (<u>www.focus.org/</u> missionarydisciples) Jesus invested in twelve men and asked them to share their faith with others. In making disciples, our focus should not be on the total number of disciples but on the intensity of the flame within them. The hotter the flame, the deeper the relationship with God and others. Our standard of success should not be based on how many people came to be fed, but on how many people are going to help feed others. This is from 2 Timothy 2:2 -"entrust to faithful people who will have the ability to teach others as well." The model is based on Jesus' teaching. WIN – lead souls to encounter Jesus. BUILD - personally invest in people and accompany them on their faith journey. SEND - "go and make disciples."

Marriage – Dr. Edward Sri (www.edwardsri.com) retold the following story by Pope Benedict regarding the Wedding at Cana. The first wine served at the wedding was great. This is similar to marriage, when our initial love is great but, after some time, may fade. The second wine, the wine made by Jesus, is far superior to the first. Similar to marriage, when Jesus is part of a marriage, the union is strong and deep. Jesus transforms our love and makes it grow, just as He transformed water into wine. Dr. Sri added that, in marriage, one of the best things we can do is to be grateful for our spouse and always assume a positive intent from our spouse. When our spouse stumbles, how do we respond? Do we love more or

do we withdraw our love? God brings our imperfections to the surface so that they can be healed.

Parenting – Mike and Alicia Hernon

(messyfamilyproject.org) talked about building a path of holiness for our families. The breakdown of the family over the decades has helped lead to the decline of the Church. To rebuild the Church, we need to rebuild the family. Parents need God's mercy to help raise their kids. Parenting exposes our weaknesses and shows our need for God. If we want to be great parents, we have to be great spouses first. Let's

make sure marriages are right for the sake of chil-

Spiritual Warfare – Jessica Navin gave insights into spiritual warfare. Spiritual warfare is an everyday occurrence; however, it usually goes unnoticed because this is a battle primarily for the mind. Evil spirits can't directly affect our actions but they can tempt us through imagination, memories, emotions, and reasoning. The devil does not want us united to God and will give us subtle obstacles to prayer. One of the devil's major tools is discouragement – making people feel powerless and hopeless. How do we fight back? Let's live holy lives – know our weaknesses and ask God for help, go to Confession regularly, and con-
