School Announcement

Last week while I was completing my annual retreat, Archbishop Rozanski announced a revision to the timeline for changes to the Archdiocesan grade school footprint. The announcement stated that decisions regarding schools would be discerned after the announcement of the parish models on Pentecost, 2023.

Additionally in his announcement, Archbishop Rozanski announced that our teachers will be receiving a long overdue salary raise so that they may be compensated more equitably for the time, expertise, and dedication they bring every day to our school.

The announcement by our Archbishop has jumpstarted our regular school planning process here at St. Raphael's. We are planning on having our full Pre-K and K to 8 program open next year as we know it today. For this to happen, we need our entire community to come together around our school to help make this desire a reality.

To maintain a responsible parish budget, we will need everyone's support over these next months. The just salary increases given to our teachers will raise costs in our school. While some of these costs in the short term may be absorbed by parish reserves, our parish cannot abandon responsible budgeting of our monies now. The Archdiocese will still need to approve our budget. They will not approve a budget with a large draw on reserves to close a budget gap. Additionally, teachers want assurance that we are on a path to sustainable school for the future. Proposing a budget that puts significant pressure on our reserves will not inspire confidence from our teachers. Such a path is not sustainable and cannot be our solution to this situation.

Some of these costs, then, will need to be absorbed by all of our Pre-K and K to 8 families in the form of tuition increases. The finance committee, school board, and I are examining our options toward a responsible budget with as minimal of a tuition raise as is possible. We will also likely be asking the parish to contribute more to the school through either a larger 2023 Angel Appeal or by increasing the amount of monies from the Sunday collection that will be used to subsidize our school.

With these proposed changes, especially to

tuition, I want to assure families of my pledge since I became a pastor nearly 10 years ago: we will not turn away a family from our school due to financial need. I have been assured by parish leadership that should need increase due to a raise in tuition and the ongoing inflation situation in the wider economy that parish organizations and private individuals stand ready to help our tuition assistance fund with additional funds so families can continue to send their children to our school.

In addition to these funds, we will need a healthy enrollment in our school in all grades. We will be graduating twenty-two 8th graders this year, so we will need a healthy incoming Kindergarten class to fill in our numbers. We also continue to receive much interest in our Pre-K and are hopeful for a strong enrollment in this program again next year. Also, we will need all of the other grades, from 1st-8th grade, to maintain their enrollment numbers for us to make our desire a reality of having our school next year.

A concern too about next year is having enough teachers to open our school. Many schools, including ours, had a difficult time filling out their faculty during the summer. We hope every teacher we have now will be back next year. I know we have a supportive community for our school, especially for our faculty. I encourage you to show your support to our faculty in these next months as you always do, be that through a large gesture as a class or an organization to seeing a call from a teacher as a time to work with that teacher for the good of your child. Our teachers truly care for the students they teach. Letting them know we truly appreciate it and want to work with them is the best way so they know they want to be part of our community next year.

I am hopeful that our parish community can come together and make our desire for St. Raphael the Archangel School to be open next year a reality. Whatever comes after that only God knows at this moment. We cannot assume or jump to conclusions about what that might be yet. We know that it will be discussed and prayerfully discerned inside our parish community, in those parishes that we will be joining with sometime after May, 2023, and by Archdiocesan leadership. May we trust the Holy Spirit who has guided our school and parish thus far will continue to

provide our parish with every good thing and blessing to pray for those in our parish community who have we need!
