Vocation Awareness Week

Today marks the start of Vocational Awareness Week. From the recent All Things New listening sessions, we can see the need for such a week. Consider the following statistics:

- By 2026, we will have enough active priests to put just one priest at every parish in our Archdio-
- By 2035, we will be plateauing at roughly 135 priests for our entire Archdiocese.
- Since the 1970s, the number of Catholic mar- Rosary riages celebrated in our Church has declined.

Why are these statistics so important?

Our parish and school are here because of our Catholic faith. The source of our unity and reason for being is the Eucharist. Without priests, we cannot have the Eucharist. If young people and young adults do not see the priesthood and religious life as legitimate options for them to consider, we will see the numbers of priests continue to decline, thus weakening our church even more.

Our parish and school are not just for our priests and religious though. St. Raphael is here for families to choose to engage in through prayer, participation, and generous stewardship. Increasingly though, studies show that young adults are drifting away from organized religion. They may still have some sort of spiritual side to them, but the rate of young people getting married in the Church, or having their children baptized, is sadly declining.

Our parish and school are sound today from a community aspect and financially as well. But if we do not begin addressing this trend among our young people, will they choose a Catholic wedding or another kind of ceremony? If so, what will be the reality here and at other parishes when our children want to get married? Will they want to have their children baptized? Will they make the same sacrifices as so many of our families do to enroll their children in a Catholic school?

Promoting vocations, then is not a side issue right now. It is essential for our future as a Church.

This week, then, is a time for us to remember the importance of vocations and to take some time to speak to our children and grandchildren about a vocation to marriage, priesthood, religious, or generous

single life.

"Jesus has a specific task in life for each and every one of us. Each one of us is hand-picked, called by name by Jesus! There is no one among us who does not have a divine vocation! Some are called audibly by God, but the usual kind of call is internal, through the inner working of the Spirit." ~Homily by Pope Saint John Paul II
