Parish School of Religion (PSR)

We are so grateful to so many families who trust St. Raphael the Archangel School for the education of their children. In these cases, families often send their children to a Parish School of Religion Program (PSR).

If you are a parishioner of St. Raphael the Archangel and plan on sending your child(ren) to a PSR program for the 2022-23 school year, I ask that you meet with me by October 15 of this year. This meeting is so we can touch base on where your child is in faith formation and how the parish can serve your family. I believe this meeting is so essential that any parish portion of program fees for your chosen PSR Program will be withheld until this meeting takes place.

Parents are the first educators of their children, and I in no way want to infringe on this parental obligation. I simply want to be sure that all of our young people are learning the faith and all of our families feel welcomed and involved in the life of the parish.
