But the word of God is not chained. (2 Tim 2:9)

St. Paul wrote these words to his beloved disciple St. Timothy from house arrest in Rome. He wrote them to encourage St. Timothy that, even though he was suffering in chains for the Gospel, his hope remained firm in the liberating power of the Gospel.

This line of Scripture recently came up in my personal prayer. A focus in the Archdiocese right now is evangelization. This is a large term, but it has at least three components to it:

The first is a basic level of openness to the Gospel message. In the Gospels and in the Acts of the Apostles, we read of large crowds going out to hear Jesus or the apostles preach. To journey from one's home to listen to a speaker reveals a basic level of openness to the preacher's message.

The second is evangelization. Evangelization is hearing and experiencing the power of the Gospel message. This means that I have heard the message of the preacher or am reading the Gospel and experiencing how it can help me in my daily life. This effect can be felt in many ways: from turning away from poor decisions and sin to living a life of better choices and treating people with charity.

The last level is catechesis. Catechesis is experiencing the Gospel message and wanting to go deeper into the teachings of the faith. This is what inspires people to read the Catechism or to attend adult faith studies.

As you read these three levels, where are you in your personal journey of evangelization? How is God calling the word to be unchained in your life?
