# Advent – a time of comfort

Our readings this weekend speak to us of comfort, a call to rely on the comfort found only in the reliance upon the mercy of God. We are introduced to John the Baptist who speaks in the desert a promise of healing and fulfillment. Where in our lives are we in need of fulfillment? This is not a promise of mere satisfaction, but of fulfillment where sins are forgiven, relationships are healed, people are united, and lives of holiness are accessible to us all. This is the message that John proclaims in the most unlikely place – a desert. With all the appearance of barrenness, emptiness, and want, John speaks to fulfillment. May we hope with the prophecy of John, trusting that in God we will find forgiveness and fulfillment in the day of the Lord. May our Advent preparations make ready our lives to receive the grace of the "One mightier than I who is coming...."

# Rorate Coeli Mass During Advent with Fr. Madden

Would you like to participate in an ancient Advent tradition? Do you like candlelight? Are you, at least, indifferent to using Latin? If the answer is "yes" to these questions, then please join us for the Rorate Coeli Mass on Friday, December 15, at 7:00pm at St. Gabriel with Fr. Mark Madden. This tradition stems from a votive Mass to Our Lady during Advent, traditionally celebrated in monasteries and convents. The name "Rorate Coeli" comes from the entrance antiphon and translates to "Drop down, ye heavens." Two aspects of this Mass are: it is celebrated in the dark of night and illuminated by candlelight. The Mass will be celebrated in Latin. If you are a bit rusty or have never learned or spoken Latin before, there is an opportunity to brush up and prepare for the Mass by attending a couple of classes at 4:00pm, Sunday, December 3 and 10, in the St. Gabriel Rectory basement. Enter the side door on Tamm. Do not fear if you can't pick it up or are unable to make the classes; you're still invited to attend and participate in the Mass as much as you are able. Reception to follow in the cafeteria. We hope to see you there and then.
