Reading I Mi 5:1-4a

Thus says the LORD: You, Bethlehem-Ephrathah too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel; whose origin is from of old, from ancient times. Therefore the Lord will give them up, until the time when she who is to give birth has borne, and the rest of his kindred shall return to the children of Israel. He shall stand firm and shepherd his flock by the strength of the LORD, in the majestic name of the LORD, his God; and they shall remain, for now his greatness shall reach to the ends of the earth; he shall be peace.

First he says, "Sacrifices and offerings, holocausts and sin offerings, you neither desired nor delighted in." These are offered according to the law. Then he says, "Behold, I come to do your will." He takes away the first to establish the second. By this "will," we have been consecrated through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? For at the moment the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the infant in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

Mass Times for Christmas and The Feast of the Holy Family

The times for Christmas Masses for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day are as follows:

- Christmas Eve 4:30pm and 10:00pm
- Christmas Day 8:00am and 10:00am

On Christmas Day, we will not have confessions before the morning Mases as we typically do on Saturday mornings.

The solemnity of Christmas supersedes every other celebration, including Sunday Mass. With this being the case, we cannot have a 4:30pm Mass on Saturday, December 25, as the Mass would count for Christmas Day, not for Sunday. The 4:30pm Mass next Saturday is thus canceled as well as confessions from 3:45-4:20pm that day as well.

The only Masses for the Sunday obligation next week on Sunday, December 26 will be at 8:00am and 10:00am.

Just a reminder to keep your eyes open for the return of the vocational chalice next month! We will be sending out a Signup Genius soon for families to take the vocational chalice home with them to pray in a particular way for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

### **Guidelines for Christmas Masses, 2021**

Our parish leadership is continuing to closely monitor all updates from the Saint Louis City Health Department and the Archdiocese of Saint Louis to make our celebration of Christmas as safe as possible this year. As of November 30, 2021, here is our plan for Christmas Masses:

### Before You Come To Mass

- Thoroughly wash your hands.
- Please bring a mask or face covering with you in compliance with the mask mandate of Saint Louis City.
- If you are sick, under a quarantine order, or are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, please stay home and participate in Mass virtually.

### When You Arrive at Mass

- All pews will be open and social distancing will not be enforced. Please be aware of this, especially if you plan on coming to our 4:30pm Mass on Christmas Eve, which is normally standing room only.
- Please wear your mask as you enter the church until you leave the church building. There will not be incense at any of the Christmas Masses to facilitate safe mask wearing.

- Use hand sanitizer as you enter and leave the church.
- Drop off your offertory gift in the baskets located at the Highfield and Jamieson entrances.
- Thank God for the gift of being able to attend Mass together in Church.

### Reminders

- Clergy will also wear masks except when proclaiming the Gospel and preaching.
- The pews are sprayed with disinfectant daily and the entire church is mopped as well.
- Twice per week, our cleaning company sprays the church with Virex, a chemical that is certified safe for hospitals and nurseries, but kills all viruses, including COVID-19.

If you have any questions or concerns about these guidelines, please contact Fr. John or Msgr. Stehly. Thank you and let us continue to pray for the gift of being able to celebrate Christmas safely together this year and beyond!
