READINGS FOR FEBRUARY 13, 2022 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I Jer 17:5-8

Thus says the LORD: Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the LORD. He is like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth. Blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose hope is the LORD. He is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream: it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit.

Reading II 1 Cor 15:12, 16-20

Brothers and sisters: If Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all. But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Gospel Lk 6:17, 20-26

Jesus came down with the Twelve and stood on a stretch of level ground with a great crowd of his disciples and a large number of the people from all Judea and Jerusalem and the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon. And raising his eyes toward his disciples he said: "Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is yours. Blessed are you who are now hungry, for you will be satisfied. Blessed are you who are now weeping, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you, and denounce your name as evil on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are filled now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will grieve and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for their ancestors treated the false prophets in this way."



ANNOUNCING OUR 2022 SRA LENTEN PROJECT, "Serving Those Who Serve Us": SCHOOL SISTERS OF NOTRE DAME

You should have received a letter from Father John, explaining in detail our 2022 SRA Lenten project which will be to assist the School Sisters of Notre Dame (SSND) of St. Louis. This community of religious sisters has been influential here in the life of SRA, teaching in our grade school from 1951 through mid-1979. Our project will be to aid these sisters and other St. Louis School Sisters of Notre Dame who have served us faithfully over the years not only at SRA, but in our community in general.

As in the past, our Lenten Project will have both a financial component and a service component. The financial component has a goal of \$5,000; these funds will be used to help the Sisters minister in their different apostolates: helping victims of human trafficking, ministering to prisoners, and serving as hospital chaplains. The service component (which will include our SRA school students) will help the almost 100 retired religious who live at the motherhouse on East Ripa Avenue. We will make care packages for these 100 sisters. More details will follow regarding the donations.

In a couple of weeks, we will have envelopes in church for your donations to this Lenten project. We are also arranging for a guest speaker from SSND at our upcoming weekend Masses. We are excited about this opportunity to help those who have served us over the many years. Thank you.


