

If any one among you considers himself wise in this age, let him become a fool, so as to become wise. Gospel Mt 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Our Lenten Journey 2023 From Fr. John

"See, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? In the wilderness I make a way, in the wasteland, rivers." - Is. 43:19

Lent is a time when the Lord desires to do something new in our lives. While this fact is true every Lent, this Lent it is especially so. This is the Lent that precedes the All Things New announcements and the changes coming to our local Church of St. Louis. These coming changes will call us all to different changes and challenges that we have not faced before as a people of faith. Our God, though, remains faithful to us. I believe He is ready and willing to pour a deluge of graces over the soil of our Archdiocese. Will these graces be ready to be received by willing hearts, though, or will our hearts remain closed so that our own agenda and plans remain safe? Will fear and doubt keep us from opening in trust to Our Loving and Merciful Father?

May we resolve now, together as a people of faith, to enter this Holy Season with a personal, parishwide, and Archdiocesan-wide desire to live the Season of Lent.

We live the Lenten Season personally through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (from https://nolacatholic.org/prayer-fasting-and-almsgiving):

- Prayer: Prayer is conversation with God. It is essential for fasting and almsgiving because prayer gives us the strength to fast.
- Fasting & Abstinence: Fasting and abstinence are old traditions in Judeo-Christian history and early Lenten practice. Found in the Scriptures, they offer a way of growing closer to God. Pope Francis reminds us, "Fasting makes sense if it really chips away at our security and, as a consequence, benefits someone else..."
- Almsgiving: Almsgiving (giving) is a response to God, one that we can come to through prayer
 and fasting. It is a way to live out our gratitude for all that God has given us, reflecting the realization that we are the Body of Christ, responsible for each other.

As a parish, we will focus on the Holy Rosary. Everyone is encouraged to pray at least one decade of the Rosary per day, reflecting on a particular one of the mysteries of the Rosary.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

<u>"For God so loved the world that he gave</u> his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (February 22, 2023), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 7, 2023) are days of *abstinence* (refraining from meat) for all Catholics *from age 14 onwards*. On these two days, *fast*, as well as *abstinence*, is also obligatory for those *from the ages of 18-59*. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

Feast of Saint Patrick (March 17, 2023) falls on a Friday during Lent this year. Feasts of the Church are meant to be a day of celebration and rejoicing, so on this Friday, March 17, 2023, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis are dispensed from abstaining from meat should they choose to celebrate the Feast of Saint Patrick.


