Fr. Molini's Notes

Who likes a test?

Nobody likes being tested. Although tests are inevitable in education, we are often tested throughout life by circumstances and events that “test our mettle” and perhaps even “try our patience.” Unenviable as being tested is, coming through the time of trial leaves us more aware of our abilities and areas of needed growth. Our first reading presents Abraham being tested by God, trying Abraham’s depth of love. He had already left his homeland, followed God’s call, and settled in a new place, relying on God’s direction. Then he was called to offer in sacrifice his only son. The concept would not have been unheard of to Abraham, living in an area where immolation was a practice of local pagan religions. As Abraham was growing in his relationship with his God, we see his actions again following His command. A test, certainly in the extreme, but nonetheless a test.

We know the story ends with God not demanding the life of the child but celebrating the obedience of Abraham. Our Lenten season is an action of intentional obedience, testing our determination to deepen our relationship with God, who in the end does not spare His only Son but allows Jesus’ sacrifice to secure our salvation. What is our response to such sacrificial love?

Another element of the story is the silent walk to the mountain. While we see Abraham’s obedience in action, we do not know his thoughts. What might he have been thinking, praying about, along that journey? Perhaps part of the lesson is the “doing” of faithfulness leads to deeper love. How often have we acted as we should, only to learn from the action a deeper truth about love, faithfulness, endurance, passion? Sometimes the moments I least want to pray, but do, become my most fruitful moments with God.

Perhaps obedience to God’s will is the threshold to a deeper relationship.

DECLINE TO SIGN!

Pro-abortion supporters are attempting to put forth a ballot measure that would add an amendment to the Missouri Constitution that would legalize abortion throughout all stages of pregnancy. The ballot measure advocates for a right to dangerous late-term abortions paid for with taxpayer money and without parental consent for minors and without regard for the health of Missouri women.
