Reading I Sirach 27: 4-7

When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do one's faults when one speaks. As the test of what the potter molds is in the furnace, so in tribulation is the test of the just. The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had; so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks, for it is then that people are tested.

Where, O death, is your sting?* The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

Gospel Lk 6:39-45

Jesus told his disciples a parable, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, 'Brother, let me remove that splinter in your eye,' when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye." "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For people do not pick figs from thornbushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles. A good person out of the store of goodness in his heart produces good, but an evil person out of a store of evil produces evil; for from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks."

Lent Begins

On February 18, Major League Baseball announced that it is postponing the start of Spring Training. This annual tradition for baseball fans heralds the end of the long winter break from baseball. It means that spring is coming soon and, with it, baseball games being played.

Thankfully, the Holy Father has not delayed the start of our spring training this year. Our annual spring training, called Lent, begins this Wednesday with Ash Wednesday.

Lent is a time for us to train ourselves for the journey toward Heaven. We do that by trying to live more fully the life of Heaven on Earth.

We fulfill that by denying ourselves something we usually enjoy. This is not to make ourselves miserable but instead to increase our desire for deeper things of the Lord that truly fulfill us.

It is a good practice, then, not just to give something up for Lent, but to fill the room we are making in our lives with a holy practice. This might be prayer, reflection, the practice of virtue, or anything that will help us to receive the life of God even more fully.

Enclosed in the bulletin is our annual Lenten Commitment Card. Please take some time to prayerfully review it and ask yourself what the Lord might be asking you to do this Lent to come closer to Him.

In addition to our own personal efforts, the Archbishop has announced the penances of fasting and abstinence that we will embrace this Lent as a community.

Archdiocesan Lenten Regulations

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penances for all Catholics, so that we too might have eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onward. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, fast and abstinence are obligatory for those from the ages of 18 to 59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals, and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation. We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

Summer Camp

For many years, Ms. Molly has been the director of our summer camp program here at St. Raphael. With her taking on the additional duties of being the Pre-K Director, she has asked to step down from her role as Director of Summer Camp. Mrs. Hayes and I thank Ms. Molly for her years of dedicated service to our students in this role and her continued service to our school as Pre-K Director and Pre-K "A" Lead Teacher, as well as assisting our Club Tobias Program.

We are currently looking for someone to fill this open position of Summer Camp Director. This is a paid position, with compensation consummate to one's experience and educational background. The Summer Camp Director handles the registration process, assists the parish office with billing, and helps to develop and implement the camp itself.





SRA Lenten Project... Serving Those who Serve Us: School Sisters of Notre Dame (SSND)


