

Entrance Antiphon Ps 66 (65): 4

All the Earth shall bow down before you, O God, and shall sing to you, shall sing to your name, O Most High!

Reading 1 Is 49:3, 5-6

The LORD said to me: You are my servant, Israel, through whom I show my glory. Now the LORD has spoken who formed me as his servant from the womb, that Jacob may be brought back to him and Israel gathered to him; and I am made glorious in the sight of the LORD, and my God is now my strength! It is too little, the LORD says, for you to be my servant, to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and restore the survivors of Israel; I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.

John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.' I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known to Israel." John testified further, saying, "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

#### **School News**

#### From Ms. Franks: 2nd Grade

Our Money unit ended with a Class Store where we were tested on our knowledge of counting coins and finding the total. In Writing we focused on Procedural Writing and made our very own Pie In A Cup!

From Miss Woods: English (4 & 5) Religion (4 & 7) Social Studies (4)

Fourth and fifth grade students have just completed and shared their persuasive essays for English class. Some of them are pretty compelling!

Fourth grade students are beginning to learn about the hard life of slavery and that was one of the main causes of the Civil War.

Fourth grade students are moving on to the Third Commandment in Religion class. They are having fun creating a slide show of the Ten Commandments.

Seventh grade students are finishing up Chapter 14. They have learned about the Beatitudes.

From Mrs. Holbrook: Religion (5), Math (4-6), Literature/Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

I hope that everyone had a blessed Christmas holiday!

Fifth Grade: During Religion the students will be learning about the parts of the Mass in detail. They will also be working on reading stories in book B in Literature. The focus in math will be dividing decimals, then beginning fraction concepts.

Fourth Grade: The focus in math will be Unit 4, multiplying by 1 and 2 digit numbers. Literature class will read stories in book B. While reading, the students will learn more about the point of view in the stories.

Sixth Grade Standard Math: Now that Chapter 4 has been covered, students will move on to Chapter 5, which covers all fraction operations. There will be a quiz halfway through the chapter on adding and subtracting fractions.

From Mrs. Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8)

Religion: Grade Six students have learned about the Ten Commandments and are studying how the Israelites finally are able to return to the Promised Land. Grade Eight students are completing their study of the Catholic Church in the first century. They are about to begin exploring the Church in the Middle Ages.

Social Studies: Grade 6 students are completing their study of the cultures and geography of North Africa and Southwest Asia. Grade 7 students will discover the roots of Islam as part of their world history program. Grade 5 students are learning about the Midwest Region and are continuing their study of the American Revolution. Grade 8 students are about to complete the Civil War and will begin studying the period of Reconstruction that followed.

Some children and their families from our parish community recently visited Mother of Perpetual Help Assisted Living to sing Christmas Carols with the residents.


#### **Ladies' Club January Meeting**
