2022: A Year of Blessings

This weekend marks the transition between the end of a year and the beginning of a new year. Such transitions are a time for us to pause and reflect on what has come. Such reflection can help us to see how we are to proceed and to grow as a people of faith.

This year in particular, I think there is a temptation to look at the year that has been and to mark it simply by one event: the unveiling and the first phases of All Things New. To do so leads us to look back on the year and see it through the lens of how we feel about All Things New. Such a reflection then colors the year to come through a similar lens as we look to the parish announcement in May and the school process in the fall.

When we look back and look ahead in this way, we miss the subtleness of what God is doing in our community. Yes, All Things New is a big thing in our faith community, but it is not the only thing. There is much richness happening in our community that we can miss if we just stay at this level.

For example, in March we had our first Trivia Night in the gym since the beginning of the pandemic. Our community then tested our knowledge again in November with the 2022 Trivia Night. These were both fun evenings to celebrate with our community.

In May, we had our first in-person Black and Gold Dinner Auction since the pandemic. This was a moment of celebration for our community as we came together to support our school. The funds raised from this evening helped to purchase new equipment for our cafeteria and to provide a bonus for our school teachers.

Also in May, we were able to return to our tradition of celebrating First Holy Communion and Graduation at Sunday Mass with the entire community. These #SRAstrong were joyous celebrations of faith that everyone could participate in.

In June, we held our first Block Party on Bishops Place. It was a great event where we saw the School Sisters of Notre Dame receive the proceeds of our Lenten Project. They also stayed to party with us on the parking lot. What a blessing!

In summer, we welcomed back our summer camp. It was so good to see our campus full of life as

the students participated in various activities.

In August, we gave thanks to Deacon Jerry for his many years of dedicated service to our parish. It was a blessing to see so many in our community come together to thank him for all he had done over the years. Shortly after, we welcomed Deacon Bob Leake to our community. Among these transitions, we held our first Watermelon Festival and Pickleball Tournament in Francis Park. What a great day for many in our community to come out and celebrate our school!

This fall saw the launch of a new Prayer Shawl Ministry in our community. We also prepared for Christmas through "praying like a pirate" and participating in Eucharistic Adoration and prayer groups.

God continues to be so good to our parish community. For these and all of the blessings I failed to mention, thank you, Lord! May we continue to see God's blessings this coming year as He draws us closer to Himself and to one another in prayer and community life.




