

READINGS FOR JANUARY 9, 2022 THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Reading I Is 42:1-4, 6-7

Thus says the LORD: Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased, upon whom I have put my spirit; he shall bring forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street, a bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench, until he establishes justice on the earth; the coastlands will wait for his teaching. I, the LORD, have called you for the victory of justice, I have grasped you by the hand; I formed you, and set you as a covenant of the people, a light for the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out prisoners from confinement, and from the dungeon, those who live in darkness.

You know the word that he sent to the Israelites as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all, what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him."

Gospel Mt 3: 13-17

Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and you are coming to me"? Jesus said to him in reply, "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he allowed him. After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased."

What Are Some Characteristics of a Missionary Disciple?



- One who attends Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation on a regular basis
- Spends time in daily personal prayer, prayer with his/her spouse, and prayer as a family
- Seeks opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration and other forms of prayer with the Church community
- Participates in faith formation activities
- Volunteers time and talent with worthy causes
- Shares the love of Jesus with others not in a preachy way, but in a way of personal witness and from personal experience.

Am I willing to become a Missionary Disciple? Am I acting on this desire in an active way right now?

News From Our School

From Mrs. Amanda Knauer: Religion, Math, Reading, Vocabulary/Spelling (4-5)

Fifth Grade: The fifth graders have been studying the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We discussed where the Sacrament comes from and the meaning behind it. We are now going through each part of the Mass and are discussing in-depth why we do and say the things we do during the liturgy. During Math, the students began their unit on decimals. They have learned how to read, write, order, and compare them. We are now working on solving problems that include decimals. In Literature, the students have been very excited about "Book Club." Each student is expected to read a portion of the book and complete a job that they will share with the rest of the group. The jobs will help the students with asking questions, connecting text, summarizing, finding and learning the meaning of interesting words, and visualizing.

Fourth Grade: In Math, the students have been diligently working on solving multiplication problems. I am so proud of how quickly and accurately the students can solve basic multiplication facts. During Literature, the class is currently reading *There's a Boy in the Girl's Bathroom*. The students have enjoyed laughing about the characters. We are discussing each part of the story in great detail.

Mrs. Christy Connor: Religion (6 & 8) Social Studies (5-8) Religion: Students in grade six have begun to learn about Moses and the Exodus.

Eighth grade students are completing the four marks of the Catholic Church.

Social Studies: Students in eighth grade will be completing a unit on Reconstruction. They will then begin to study the Industrial Revolution.

Students in grade seven and grade five are learning about the thirteen British colonies.

In grade six, we are learning about ancient China and will soon be moving on to studying ancient Japan.
